ERAOF PROSPERITY IN U. S. PREDICTED

R. M. Gray, Back From East, Says Prices to Stay High.

INDUSTRIAL CENTERS BUSY.

Work of Oregon Welcome Committee in New York Lauded by Portland Clothier.

The United States is about to enter the most prosperous period in its history, is the word brought back from eastern business centers by R. M. Gray, clothier, who returned yesterday from a several weeks' trip. New York, Chicago and Washington are like great carnivals by day and night, says Mr. Gray, who predicts that prices will remain high through the reconstruction period.

"The world lacks food, clothes and materials in amounts up to billions of dollars," said Mr. Gray yesterday.

"This country alone can supply these materials and has the capacity for production. Because lumber is to be one of the greatest factors in the rebuilding the northwest should get its building, the northwest should get its share of the prosperity that is open-

Foreign Trade Leaps Up. In January—just one month—our foreign trade amounted to \$410,000,000, as against a total of \$470,000,000 for

as against a total of \$470,000,000 for the entire year of 1914.

"In New York last week were men from France, who are to buy \$40,000,000 worth of machine tools, the same in machinery, \$100,000,000 worth of raw materials, 800 locomotives and 59,000 railway cars. American bankers last week arranged credit for Belgium to \$50,000,000, the entire amount to be used in purchase of raw materials. The same amount has been arranged between Berlin and New York bankers for credit of Germany in purchase of materials.

Eastern Cities Crowded. "All eastern cities are thronged with people. New York papers estimate that 100,000 persons leave New York each night to find sleeping accommodations, returning for business the dations, returning for business the next day.
"New York has built 13 big hotels-

two of them housing 2000 persons each
—in the past year, but still can't take
care of the 2,500,000 transients, which, care of the 2,500,000 transients, which, it is estimated, she has every day. "Broadway and her 25-foot sidewalks can't hold the crowds who overflow into the streets. Theaters—good, bad and indifferent—are filled to capacity and standing room every night. The best shows can be seen only by reserving seats three to five weeks shead of time. Hotel rooms must be secured ten days in advance in most cases.

Prices to Stay High Is View. "Prices of commodities are likely to remain high. Slight decreases are exremain high. Slight decreases are expected in cost of raw woolen and cotton goods, but 25 to 46 per cent increase in labor costs will more than balance this and make the cost of clothes slightly higher than at present." Radical changes in women's styles are on deck for this season, according to Mr. Gray. More than 90 per cent of the women's coats being sold in New York are capes and dolmans, he says. "In women's suits, loose belted effects will rule," he says. "Suits will be smart for street and outing wear. No plain tailored or fitted garments will be made. Fancy embroidered vests will go with these suits.


