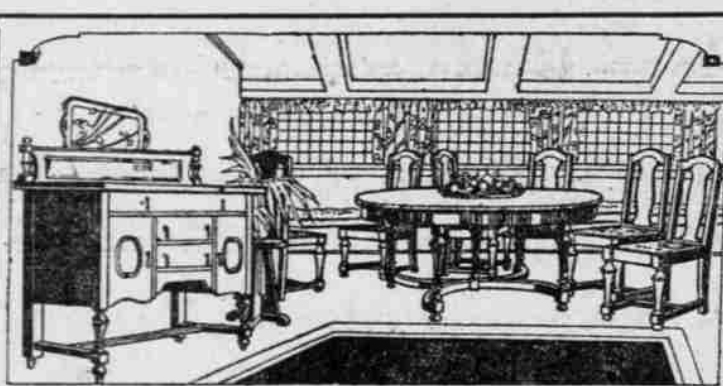

CAROLINA LAZZARI AND OTHER NOTED OPERA STARS SIGNED FOR OPERA SEASON OF 1919-20

Success of Summer Attractions Detract Materially From Speculation as to Plans of Theater Managers for Coming Winter—New York Military Band Prospers.

NEW YORK, June 28.—(Special.)—New York has been so busy rejoicing in the summer music that it has almost forgotten its usual summer pastime of inventing all sorts of news concerning the next winter season. Some of the news occasionally materializes but most of it serves its purpose well and faithfully when it keeps the columns of the musical newspapers filled and interesting. Interesting indeed, because there is always a fascination in speculation and the day after a thing is definitely announced it passes into the common place.

Thus people were on the alert to know the plans of Carolina Lazzari, the brilliant young Italian-American contralto, who made such an extraordinary record with Campanini in the Chicago Opera association for the past two seasons. Now they may rest quietly, secure in the knowledge that the beautiful young artist is to be at the Metropolitan opera house. Miss Lazzari will not fill many optimistic engagements next season because she is so heavily booked in concert, there having been a veritable swarm of requests for her from all parts of the country, but she will have a few appearances to identify her with the great Broadway house.

In order to keep alive the speculation upon next season's attractions at the Metropolitan less than because Mr. Gatti-Casazza was planning to go abroad and look over the field before committing himself to any announcement, no official statement has been given out concerning the season of 1919-20, which will no doubt equal or rival in brilliancy anything that has been offered in the past by General-Director Gatti-Casazza, for whom his friends like to claim that he has no rivals in his field.

A master-coup is always ready when one expects it the least. The genial gentleman who was ill for some weeks after the close of the Metropolitan was finally due to set sail Saturday, accompanied by Moranzoni and Bambasche, two of his conductors. Mr. Gatti-Casazza might not have selected this time for a crossing but for the fact that he was most eager to see his mother since the recent death of his father. Mme. Aida will join her husband and return with him, but she will go directly to Paris for the purpose of securing an entirely new wardrobe. She has only just closed her concert season, which has been the most successful that she has ever undertaken in this country.

The demands in Europe are different from what they are in this country because the repertoire usually consists of songs in the language of the country. She has already won the distinction of having a repertoire for concert entirely unique, covering all the modern languages, one of which she is no longer using but in which she had won as much renown as in French or Italian songs. Mme. Aida was due to sail on the Espagne and she plans to return in September or perhaps in August because she has a number of concerts awaiting her in the early fall.

Edwin Franko Goldman's success with his remarkable New York military band is beyond even his own most sanguine expectations. To say that thousands throng to the concerts given on the green at Columbia university is putting it in the very mildest manner, for it would also be necessary to state that these audiences would do credit in quality.
