Open Letter to State Committee Asks Pertinent Questions.

BOISE, Idaho, June 28.—(Special.)—Members of the Non-partisan league have addressed an open letter to the state committee in which a number of pertinent questions are asked, particularly with reference to the management of the league's affairs.

Their letter is as follows: To the State Committee of the Non-Partisan League of Idaho—Gentlemen: We, the undersigned, members of the Non-Partisan League, would like to know: First—Why the state committee holds no meetings and accordingly takes no interest in the welfare of the organization?

The amendment to the public utilities act passed by the last legislature, which classifies all autos for hire, transfer and stage lines, as common carriers and requires the owners thereof to pay a license, is to be tested as to its constitutionality in the courts.

Owing to the variety of opinions held by attorneys over the state as to the legality of the law and the fact that some county attorneys have advised operators not to be governed by the law which requires them to take out a license, the state's legal department is anxious for a final ruling on the statute.

Frank R. Gooding, ex-governor of this state, who made a sensational race for United States senator last fall, when he conducted a campaign attacking the leaders of the Non-partisan league, has been rushed to Rochester, Minn., for treatment, having been stricken from a Union Pacific train at Kemmerer a few days ago while en route to his home at Gooding from Washington, D. C.

Forest fires in southern Idaho have been doing serious damage, but the forest service has succeeded in holding the flames within bounds after a hard fight. The season has been exceptionally dry and the timber is in a dangerous condition for fires.

There will be erected in this city this year a suitable memorial out of respect and in honor of the memory of the late Bishop Funsten of the Episcopal church of Idaho, a \$20,000 addition to St. Luke's hospital to be dedicated to him.

TRAGEDY SPOT LOCATED

W. D. STILLWELL FINDS PLACE CAPTAIN EMBREE FELL.

Tillamook Man, Aged 95, Vividly Recalls Attack by Indians in Washington in 1855.

TOPPENISH, Wash., June 28.—(Special.)—When Captain Abshalom Embree, United States army, was killed while scouting with a party of 16 men during the Indian war in 1855-6, Lieutenant W. D. Stillwell, now of Tillamook, Or., was close beside him as he fell from his horse.

Last Sunday Mr. Stillwell, who is now 95 years old, accompanied by his son, M. V. Stillwell, W. P. Bonney, secretary of the state historical society of Washington, of Tacoma, and L. V. McWhorter of Yakima, Wash., went out about five miles from Toppenish, Wash., where the elder Stillwell located the place where the captain met his death.

In April, 1856, Captain Embree, with 19 men, among them Lieutenant Stillwell, became separated from the main body of troops, and when attacked by the Indians, who appeared over the brow of the hill above them, took refuge in a slight depression on the side of the hill.
