

2 COLLEGE DEGREES ARE WON IN 4 YEARS

Eric Englund Graduates With Highest Honors.

WORK IS NOT FOUND HARD

University of Oregon and Oregon Agricultural College Work Taken Successfully at Same Time.

Is it possible for a student to obtain sufficient credits in courses offered by the University of Oregon and the Oregon Agricultural College during a term of four years to graduate from both institutions with highest honors? This question entered the mind of



Eric Englund, who gained degrees at both U. of O. and O. A. C. in four years.

Robert C. French, ex-president of the Western normal school and now in charge of educational work at Camp Lewis, some years ago and when he learned of a young man who desired to gain the knowledge offered by the two state educational institutions he suggested that an attempt be made to take the work offered by the two institutions simultaneously and thus avoid the necessity of spending eight years in acquiring the education desired.

Question Answered in Affirmative. Today the question stands answered in the affirmative and Eric Englund, lately discharged after serving as lieutenant in the 21st Infantry, holds degrees from both the University of Oregon and the Oregon Agricultural College, after four years' work.

Mr. Englund attended the Oregon Agricultural College during the regular school terms, taking the courses in agriculture and economics offered at the state college and in addition certain courses which brought him credits from the state university. During the summer months this student attended the University of Oregon summer school and at the end of the four years received a bachelor of arts degree from the university and the degree of bachelor of science from the state college.

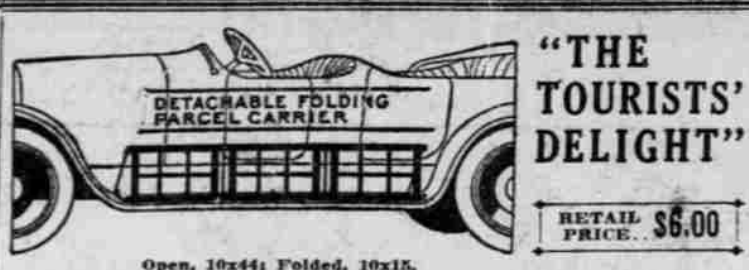
Experiment Proves Success. While the effort was in the nature of an experiment as far as Mr. French was concerned, it devolved itself into a method of acquiring the cultured courses offered at the university, combined with applied science as taught at the college in as speedy a time as possible, as far as Mr. Englund was concerned.

The plan, which has been approved by officials of the two institutions, is one which can be followed by any student with sufficient will-power to complete his studies throughout both winter and summer, according to Mr. Englund. "I do not feel that I have accomplished anything out of the ordinary," said Mr. Englund. "It was simply a matter of saving four years of work and it can be done by the average student, I am sure."

College Activities Many. Nor did this student keep his nose buried in books throughout the four years. He took a prominent part in college activities, having been associate editor of the Barometer, the college paper, for one year, and during his senior year editing the Barometer. One year he was vice-president of the student body and member of the board of control. He also served as inter-collegiate orator in both inter-collegiate debates and orations.

Mr. Englund was elected to membership in the Alpha Chi and Gamma Sigma Delta fraternities and in other ways always showed a keen and active interest in college events and affairs. The six or seven weeks which intervened between the conclusion of summer school at the university and the commencement of the fall term at the college were utilized by Mr. Englund in working on farms in the state, this serving doubly as a vacation period and at the same time affording an opportunity of obtaining cash to aid him in defraying his expenses at school.

Commission as Lieutenant Won. When Mr. Englund completed his four-year double course he enlisted
