What is described as a remarkable statue of "The Divine Healer" was recently placed in the main corridor of

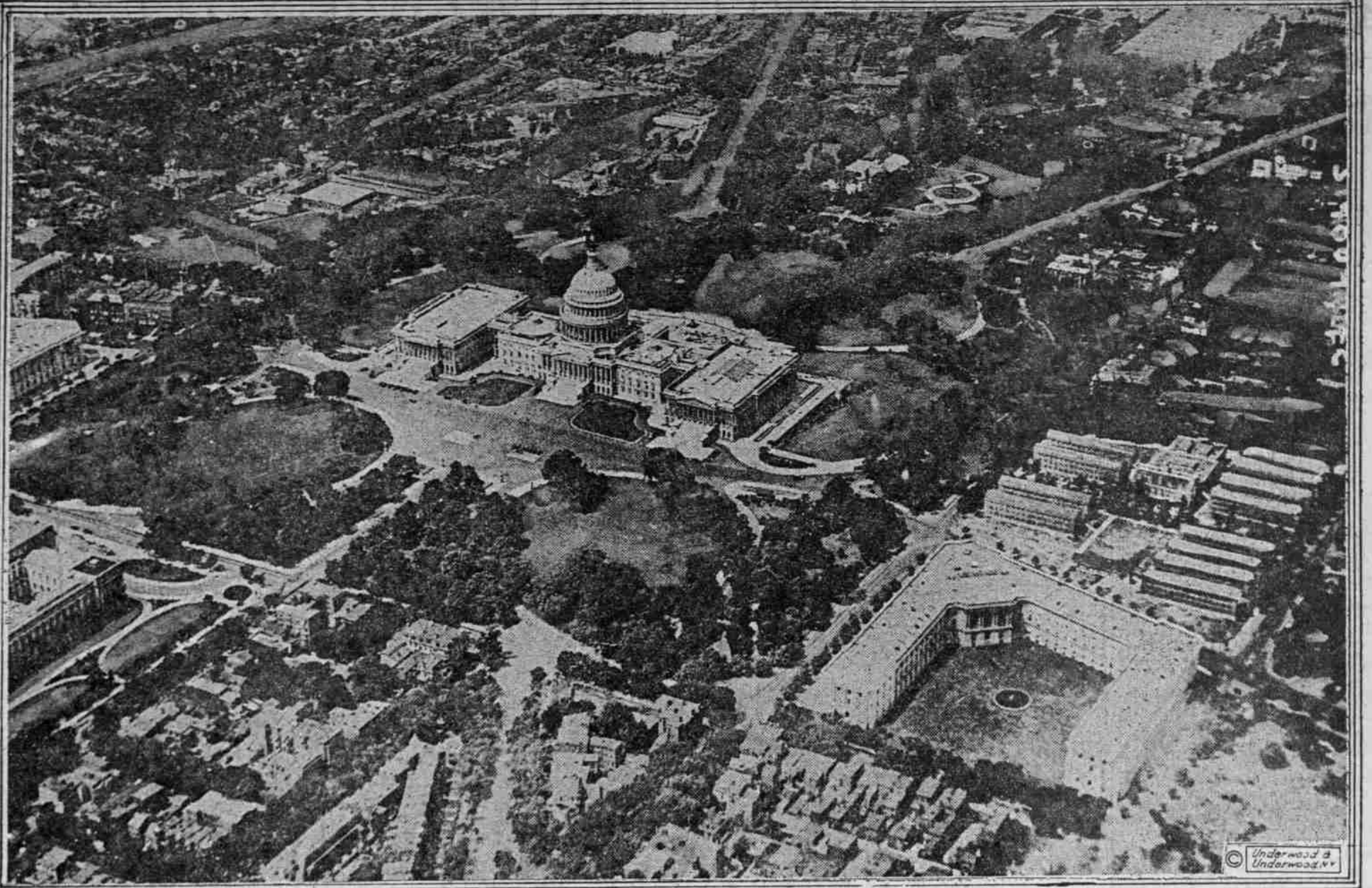
the Johns Hopkins hospital at Baltimore. The inscription on the pedestal reads: "Come unto me all ye that are weary and heavy laden and I will give you rest."

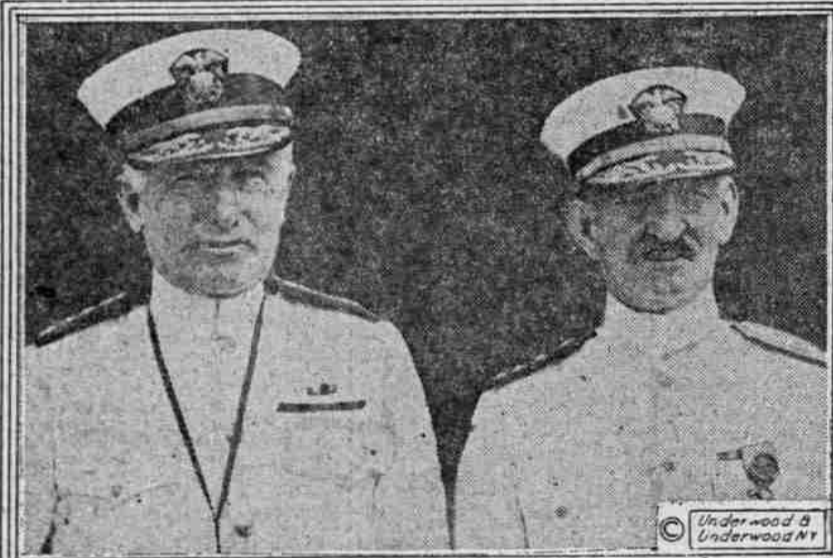

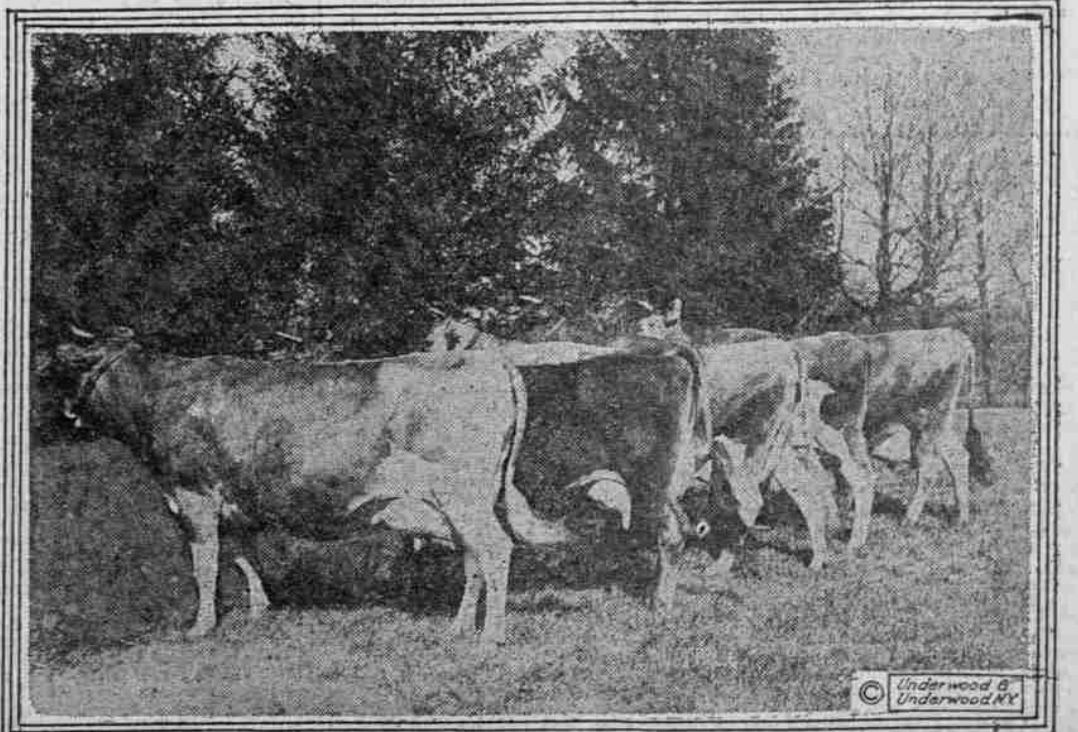
