

OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE EXPECTS BIGGEST YEAR IN HISTORY OF SCHOOL

Counts on Return of Service Men to Veritable West Point, as \$500,000 Army Equipment Is Now Being Installed for Use in Giving Military Training to Students.

THE biggest school year in the history of the Oregon Agricultural College is indicated for 1919-1920 by the volume of correspondence from prospective students. Of more than 1000 persons who withdrew in the period of the war to enter military service several hundred will be back next fall to complete their college work. Demand for trained men and women for technical work in the reconstruction period in agriculture, various branches of engineering, commerce, home economics and other subjects promises to swell the attendance. Military work will be emphasized. With infantry, field artillery, motor transport, engineer and signal corps units, for which the war department will provide many officers and more than \$500,000 in equipment, the college is expected to be a veritable West Point. Equipment for 800 infantrymen has already been received and horses and up-to-the-minute guns for the field artillery work will be shipped this summer. Model stables for housing the horses and mules will be constructed under the direction of E. P. Jackson, superintendent of buildings. Military features are under the direction of Colonel Joseph K. Partello, professor of military science and tactics. Renewed interest in agriculture, brought about by war conditions, is expected by Dean A. B. Cordley of the school of agriculture to cause an influx of students. Unprecedented activity on the part of farmers in the purchase of power machinery has created demand for skilled operators. The growing dairy industry in Oregon also requires scientifically trained men. In horticulture the science of pollination of crops and the betterment of marketing facilities through organization and co-operative selling methods will be emphasized.

Attractive positions are open to graduates specializing in various phases of agriculture. Dean Cordley has received letters this summer from graduates getting from \$1000 a year to \$2000 as net income through their productive efforts. The college is the institution of higher learning in Oregon authorized by the state to give instruction in engineering. Unprecedented demand for competent instructors in industrial arts in both elementary and high schools is far greater than the supply. The school of mines, school of forestry, school of home economics, school of commerce, school of pharmacy, and all departments have revised their courses to meet new conditions, and the instructional staff is being strengthened.

VALUE OF SPEAKING SHOWN

Precision and Effectiveness Bring Men and Women Prominence.

"Men and women of prominence must write and speak with precision and effectiveness." If this quotation is true, it is not also inversely true that to write and to speak with "precision and effectiveness" must, other things being equal, tend to greater "prominence." During its years of existence the Gillespie school has had this verified by its students in professional, business and social fields. ST. HELEN'S IS 50 YEARS OLD

Record for Constructive Work in Education Maintained.

St. Helen's Hall celebrated its 50th anniversary at commencement in June. It has had a wonderful record for constructive educational work for the past 50 years, and stands out conspicuously not only in this northwest but on the whole Pacific coast as the oldest girl's school. Its various departments include academic and elementary courses. It is on the accredited lists of the universities and colleges because of its high standard of scholastic training.

It maintains a model kindergarten and in addition to its regular courses specialized in music and art. The school is not only an educational institution, but a home of unusual refinement and culture, where young women are trained not only intellectually but are given the advantage of a strong moral atmosphere.

MORE TEACHERS ARE NEEDED

Oregon Normal School Supplying 100 Annually for State.

Oregon state normal school supplies most of the 700 or more teachers called for each year by the state's educational system. Because of its steadily rising entrance and graduation requirements, it is doing more than any other school to bring up the standard of instruction in Oregon.

Five courses leading to state, life

and one-year certificates are open to students, who may also take up special courses in school supervision, primary work, domestic art and science and library work. The institution has a corps of about 20 well-trained teachers. Opportunities are offered those who leave the state normal to take up supervisory positions, there being a course especially for this. Anyone is eligible to entrance who has completed two years of high school work or its equivalent. As every student in attendance is pledged to teach, the institution will have much to do with lessening the present shortage of competent instructors, which is causing school boards so much anxiety at the present time.

MISS CATLIN'S SCHOOL IDEAL

Educational Center for Young Girls Has Excellent Environment.

People who are desirous of placing their children in a school where the standards and methods of the leading schools of the east are in operation will be interested in the work that is being done by Miss Catlin's school.

The school was started in response to an educational need of the Pacific northwest and has been developed by a large staff of experienced and successful eastern teachers who have come west to be associated with it.

The purpose of the school is to provide an educational center for girls ranging in age from 6 to 13 years through which they may be brought into interesting contact with the knowledge and thought of the world and, hereafter realizing its relation to them be taught to think for themselves. Each child is considered as an individual and the effort is to educate her according to her particular needs.

All grades from the primary to college are provided and work in French, art, music, dramatics and physical training in addition is offered. In the high school department special provision is made for college preparatory work and the students are prepared for the leading eastern as well as the western colleges.

The number of students in each class is limited in order that there may be close personal supervision of the individuals and their work. An environment of interested, enthusiastic young workers has created results that are gratifying to the school.

The boarding department is a feature of the school and provides a happy, simple and wholesome home life for its young people. The ideal location of the new building with its surroundings of space, quiet and the beauties of nature makes a most healthful physical environment.

HILL REGISTRATION IS BIG

Record Attendance at Military College Is Promised.

Registration at Hill Military academy so far indicates that when the fall term opens September 17, there will be a banner attendance.

Although the war is over, military drill will be emphasized, as it is believed that boys receiving this training are better fitted for business and professional life or to take their place in the knowledge and thought of their country. A special drill master will be appointed to direct the younger boys and
