

RELAY RACES MAY BREAK ALL RECORDS

Promise Some Keen Contests
at Round-Up.

DRUMHELLER ADDS STRINGS

Eddie McCarthy, W. F. Parsons and
Charley Irwin Already in and
Prize List Is Large.

PENDLETON, Or., Aug. 22.—(Special.)—Relay races at this year's Pendleton round-up September 18, 19 and 20 promise to be the fastest, most keenly contested in the ten years the classic of the west has been given, those in charge of the entries say. They have their claim on the fact that four double strings of the best horses in the country will be entered in the relays.

Latest to send in his entry is George Drumheller of Walla Walla, who has many a relay title to his credit. He will have strings in the cowboys' and cowgirls' races and both can travel. The other strings entered belong to Eddie McCarthy, W. F. Parsons and Charley Irwin.

Donna Card is Drumheller's cowgirl relay rider, Lorraine Trickey rides for McCarthy and Ruth Parton rides for Parsons. These girls make turf fly when they let their horses have rein. Relay races are a big feature because they occupy all three days of the show. Every entry's time is kept each day and the total time for three days to determine the winner. One or two seconds in the total one day will often swing the prize. Four horses are ridden, each for a quarter mile each day.

Five thousand six hundred dollars in cash and trophies and jack-pot money sufficient to bring the total to \$10,000 will be offered for the 19 events on the programme. The prize list was completed this week with increases averaging 33 1/3 per cent above the prizes offered for any previous round-up.

Greatest increases have been made in the five big events on the programme, the cowboys' relay race, steer bulldozing, steer roping, cowgirls' relay race and cowboys' bucking contest. Each of the relay races for the world's championship carries a total of \$2000 in prizes, steer roping \$700, cowboys' bucking contest \$750 and the bulldozing \$550.

Trophies which are presented in addition to cash prizes include a \$400 prize saddle for the champion broncho buster, a \$300 prize saddle for the best cowgirl broncho rider and a \$300 prize saddle for the winner of the steer-roping contest. Suits of clothes, kodaks, lariats, Indian blankets and other merchandise are also on the list.

Predictions are made at round-up headquarters that the attendance this year will be the greatest ever. This conclusion is based on the number of letters asking for seats and for accommodations. Special trains from Astoria, Portland, Heppner and La Grande are now virtually assured and arrangements have been made to handle thousands of auto parties. All school grounds in the city will be used for parking autos.

Steer Bulldozing for the championship of the world—Purse \$500, first, \$300 and day money; second, \$150; third, \$100.

Cowgirls' Standing Race—Purse \$100, to be divided \$35 each day. First, \$20; second, \$10; third, \$5.

WHEAT CROP \$100,000,000

WASHINGTON ESTIMATE MADE
BY D. M. DRUMHELLER.

Yield for Bumper Year in Eastern
Section of State Is Placed at
55,250,000 Bushels.

SPOKANE, Wash., Aug. 22.—(Special.)—Washington will sell this year's wheat crop for more than \$100,000,000, according to estimates made by D. M. Drumheller of the Spokane & Eastern Trust company, who has made a survey of the yield by counties. He placed the total for eastern Washington at 55,250,000 bushels.

"This is a conservative, but it is 10,000,000 bushels more wheat than the state ever before produced as I understand it. I believe the state's record has been about 45,000,000 bushels," he said.

"The large acreage is responsible for the big total. I have not figured anything from the west side of the state, where a small crop is raised. The Spokane & Eastern estimate I had placed at 2,500,000 bushels, but I have reports from so many sections where the yield is several bushels to the acre more than was expected that I now believe it will reach a total of at least 3,000,000.

"Lincoln county has a yield within a bushel or two to the acre as an average and the acreage is large. I have reports from so many sections where the yield is several bushels to the acre more than was expected that I now believe it will reach a total of at least 3,000,000.

"Walla Walla is said to have at least 500,000 bushels above its previous record. Colville, Columbia and Asotin have bumper crops, but I am not sure how much acreage of the total is planted in barley."

BIG LINERS TRANSPORTS

Great Northern and Northern Pacific
Both to Sail on Pacific.

NEW YORK, Aug. 22.—With the sailing of the army transport Great Northern today for San Francisco, another was made that this big ship and her sister craft, the Northern Pacific, will be used permanently in the transport service on the Pacific.

Their regular route will be from San Francisco to Honolulu, Manila, Vladivostok and Yokohama, Japan, and from Honolulu and San Francisco, when the American forces are brought out of Siberia, they will come on these craft, which have made an unusual record in the transport service to and from France. They will be able to make the trip from San Francisco to Manila in 15 days.

The Great Northern and the Northern Pacific were purchased by the army from the Great Northern Railroad company at the outbreak of the war.

"BAYER CROSS" ON GENUINE ASPIRIN

Assurance Given Mr. Sinnott That
In No Event Will Rates Be Applied
Without a Hearing.

OREGONIAN NEWS BUREAU, Washington, Aug. 22.—(Special.)—Freight rates on wool from Oregon, which have been suspended by the railroad administration pending receipt of a written report from the local traffic committee at Portland, Or., it is thought may be canceled without so much as hearing the representatives of the wool growers who have been protesting vigorously. The traffic director's office told Representative Sinnott today that if it was decided to give consideration to the increased rates with the report received he will be notified immediately. In no case will the rates be applied without a hearing to the wool growers.

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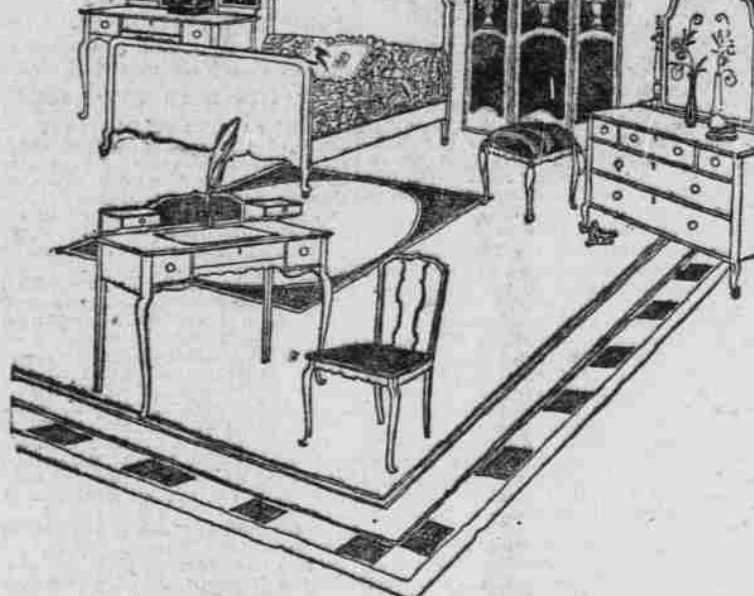
