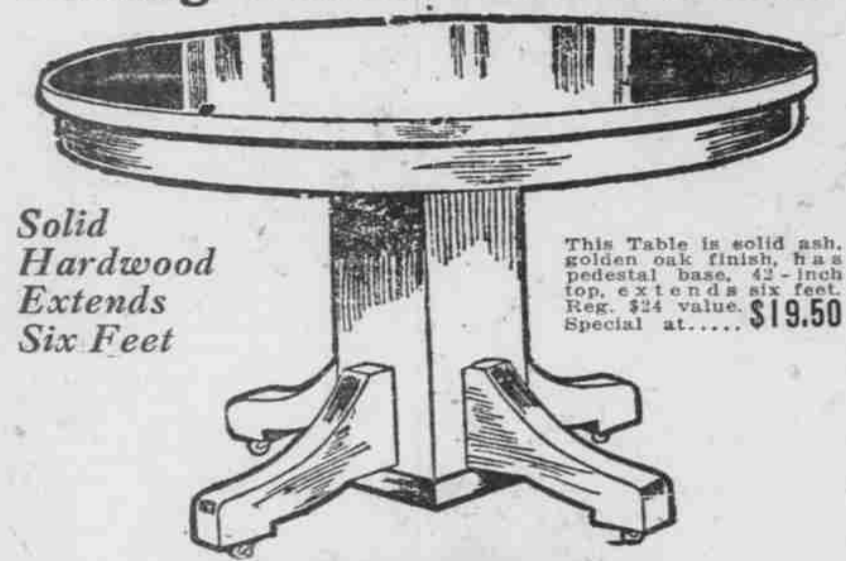

It is understood that if Roderick Macleay, finalist in the Oregon state championship, finds it possible to get away that Mr. Kerry will act as a substitute.

The team most feared by all of the aggregations which will compete for the punch bowl is the Jefferson Park club eight from the Seattle municipal links. On it will be Claire Griswold, northwest champion, and Ben Stein and others who performed valiantly at Spokane. The Jefferson Park club has produced the greatest collection of young golfers this summer than ever been forthcoming in a single season.

Walter E. Pearson, chairman of the handicap committee at Waverley, will announce the complete schedule for the club championships this week. He is awaiting word from the Seattle Golf club and the Spokane Country and Golf club relative to those two organizations sending teams to compete here against the Waverley players.
