PARIS, Oct. 18.—The following no-tice was posted at the stock exchange this afternoon: "Official - Petrograd has been taken."

LONDON, Oct. 18 .- (By the Assoclated Press.)—Petrograd tonight was so closely invested by the anti-bolshe-vik forces, according to the latest official advices, that military experts expressed the belief that little short of a miracle could save the hard-pressed bolsheviki. Indeed, one newspaper dispatch reported General Yu-denitch's cavalry in the capital; but there is no confirmation of this. Neither had British official con-firmation been received of the report-ed surrender of Kronstadt, although

For two days, it is stated, the bolaheviki gained considerable ground. The volunteers, under Generals Wrangel and Ulaggai, delivered a sharp counter attack, recovering all the ground which had been lost and inflicted severe losses on the bolsheviki. Further to the west the Cossack forces crossed the Don on a wide front, taking 1200 prisoners with many guns.

Still further westward the Cossacks occupied the line of the Khoper river, one of the northern tributaries of the Don, taking the towns of Kaiatch and Pavlovsk. Prisoners to the number of 2150, including a complete field battalion, were taken and another regiment was destroyed. Large numbers of prisoners were also taken at Orel and Chernigoff.


