Increase of fares on the street rail-

Increase of fares on the street rail-way lines of the Portland Railway, Light & Power company appears to be the probable outcome of the appli-cation of the company pending be-fore the public service commission, as a result of the award of increased pay. for platform men and classified em-ployees by the board of arbitration de-cision announced yesterday. The board found that an increase in the wage rate of 1 cent per hour for the platform men, with corresponding in-crease required for other employees, amounts to butween \$48,000 and \$50,-000 per year. Hence the increase of 6 cents per hour directed by the award will require the additional pay-ment by the company of approxi-mately \$200,000 annually, retroactive to October 1.

Date for the final hearing has hot yet been set by the commission and it is probable that it will be deferred until the middle of December, and possibly longer. The commission is giving its entire attention to the tele-phone rate case at present, the deci-sion on which must be rendered dur-ing the present month, under the law.


