CITY LEWY IS 12.7 MILLS

ORDINANCE PASSED BY COUNCIL PROVIDES \$2,981,868.

Difficulty Found in Preparing Budget Despite Increase Voted at Election.

Cost of conducting city affairs in 1920 is estimated at \$2,981,868, inclusive of both the money necessary for general affairs of the city and also the funds required to retire municipal bonds, as well as the money necessary for the various sinking funds.

By vote of the people at special election several weeks ago the city officials set an additional 12 mills for general purposes in 1920.

The budget, however, Gordon said, is extremely difficult to prepare its budget. The numerous necessary items had been pruned from the budget.

The ordinance passed yesterday shows the following tabulations in the levy:

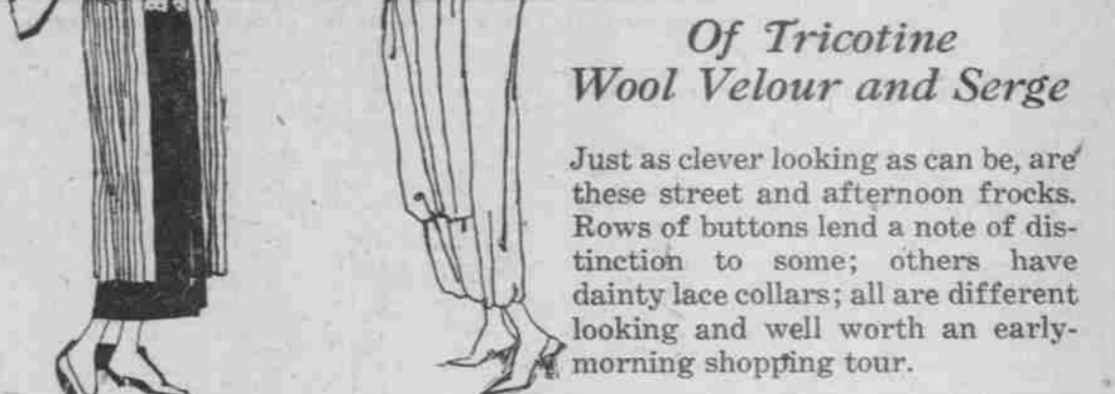
