

ASSISTANT FEDERAL PROSECUTOR RESIGNS

Barnett Goldstein to Engage in Private Practice.

300 CASES ARE HANDLED

Barnett H. Goldstein, chief deputy United States attorney, yesterday handed his written resignation to United States Attorney Humphreys, effective January 1, 1920.

War-Time Cases Handled. Mr. Goldstein first entered the United States attorney's office on May 1, 1918, under Clarence L. Reames.

Mr. Goldstein will relinquish the office of chief assistant prosecutor to enter private practice. He will open law offices in the Wilcox building the last of this week.
