SEATTLE MUNICIPAL ROADS SHOW GAINS

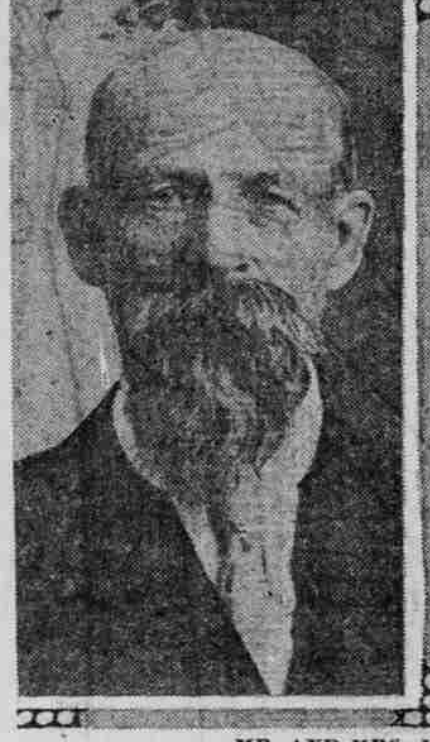
Profit of \$10,659.38 Made in First Seven Months.
