

JOHNSON IS VICTOR IN COLUMBIA COUNTY

Returns Are Complete for 19 of 21 Precincts.

STATE MEASURES CARRY

Sam Kozer Leads All in Race for Secretary of State; Chamberlain Is Favorite.

ST. HELENS, Or., May 22.—(Special)—Complete returns from 19 out of 21 precincts in Columbia county show that Johnson has carried the county. The two precincts not included in the totals are outlying and will not affect the totals as the combined number of votes will not be over 100. For republican nomination for president the vote is: Johnson, 700; Lowden, 130; Poindexter, 66; Wood, 477; Hoover, 148.

All state measures carried and Chamberlain was easy victor over Starkweather.
