LAMBERT, general manager of the Western Musical bureau, announces that he has contracted for the service of the Paulist choir of New York City for a four weeks' tour of the northwestern United States and of Western Canada and that the choir will appear in Portland in one concert only about July 17 in the public auditorium.

The contract the Western Musical bureau has signed with this organization is said to represent the largest number of concerts purchased outright on the Paulist choir by any individual or organization this trip. She has been teaching there by the faculty and students that she taught there a second term, and then she returned to the term of 1917-1918 in the Jacksonville college at Jackson, Miss. Both of these Mississippi institutions are high-class southern universities. During her stay in Jacksonville, she was a member of the management, standing throughout the south at the head of young women's institutions of learning.
