

### ASTORIA PREPARES FOR LEGION HOSTS

Lavish Entertainment to Be Provided for Veterans.

### PORTLAND MEN ASPIRE

G. S. Goodell and Cassius R. Peck Mentioned for Commander of Oregon Department.

Throughout the state former service men are looking forward to the second annual convention of the American Legion, department of Oregon, which will be held at Astoria on July 29 and 31 and August 1. While business of importance is scheduled to come up, an entertainment which will bring to mind the days of the legions is promised by Clatsop post No. 12 of the legion, concluding with a clam-bake and sham battle at Seaside.

Interest is centered in the selection of the next state commander of the American Legion. Mentioned already from Portland as probable candidates are G. S. Goodell and Cassius R. Peck, the latter past commander of Portland post.

**Pendleton After Next Meeting.**  
Pendleton already has thrown down the gauntlet as a competitor for the next state convention. Official said to be in the field against Pendleton is Albany.

Jesse R. Hinman, past commander of Clatsop post, is chairman of the convention committee, which is composed of eight members from Astoria and two from Portland, and which was appointed several months ago by William B. Follett, state commander of the legion.

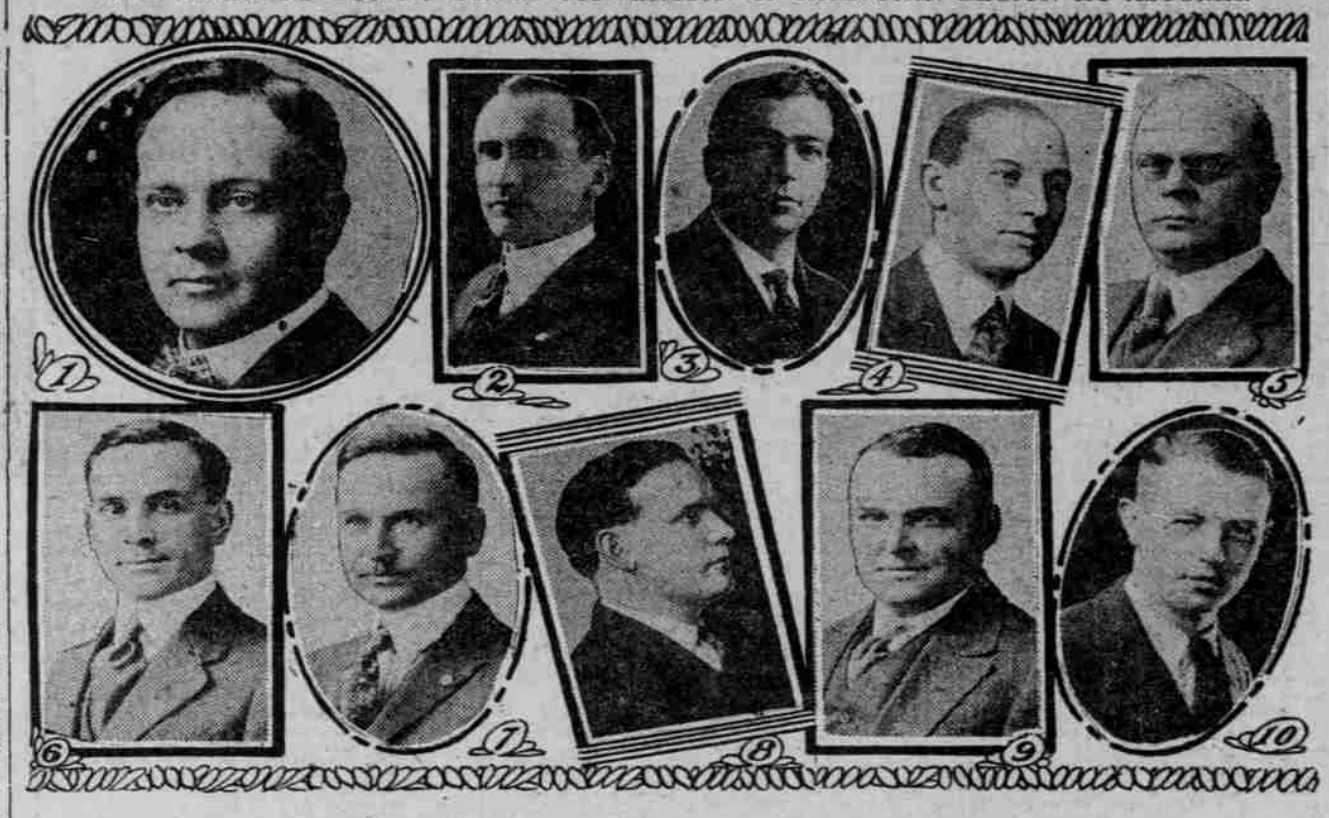
According to the programme, delegates will arrive in a special train from Portland on Thursday night, July 23, and will be met by a reception committee from Astoria post and assigned accommodations. At 8:30 that evening there will be a band concert and dancing in the streets.

**Governor to Give Address.**  
Sessions of the convention proper will open at 9:30 Friday morning with invocation by Major W. S. Gilbert, captain of the 3d Oregon. Mayor James Bremner of Astoria will welcome the visitors and Department Commander Follett will reply for the legion. An address by Governor Oset will follow and appointment of committees will conclude the morning work.

The meeting will resume at 1:30 and continue until 5 o'clock with routine business. At 7:30 Friday night a boxing card will be presented at the Astoria theater. The annual convention hall will open at 9 o'clock on Saturday, July 31, the delegates will be taken on a sightseeing trip over the city at 9 o'clock and the meeting will open at 10 o'clock. At 1:30 a patriotic and historical parade will be staged.

RANK AND FILE FOR EX-TREASURER, SAYS ALTERNATE.  
Mrs. Alice M. McNaught Tells of Democratic Convention at Women's Club Meeting.

"The rank and file of the democrats of the United States wanted William Gibbs McAdoo for president," declared Mrs. Alice M. McNaught, alternate at the democratic convention who addressed the Democratic Women's club yesterday afternoon in room A of the central library on her impressions of the convention.

Mrs. McNaught bases McAdoo's defeat on the fact that he had no organization. She hastened to explain that although she was one of McAdoo's most ardent supporters, she was not against Cox. She declared that Cox cannot make the country wet unless congress so wills it and cautioned every woman to take care to put the right men into congress.

The speaker characterized the convention as one of the fairest, most open conventions in the world and said that she wished everyone of her democratic friends could have been present. Mrs. McNaught passed her alternate's badge about among the club members and said that it meant more to her than a \$100 bill.

### OREGON CAMP DESERTED

SOLDIERS ARE GIVEN LEAVE TO VISIT POINTS ON SOUND.

State Rifle Competition Opens to Select Team to Be Sent to Camp Perry, Ohio.

CAMP LEWIS, Wash., July 10.—(Special.)—The Oregon camps here were all but deserted this afternoon when leave was given to two-thirds of the entire command to leave camp from Saturday noon until Sunday night. Many of the Oregon citizen soldiers are visiting Tacoma, Seattle and other Puget sound points after a busy week spent in drilling and maneuvering. Those required in camp to keep up the necessary guard duty and routine will be permitted by Colonel C. C. Hammond, regimental commander, to leave next Saturday afternoon and Sunday.

The state rifle competition opened this morning on the camp rifle range and on the result selections will be made by the adjutant-general of those who are to attend the national rifle competition at Camp Perry, O., early next month.

Eighteen Oregon soldiers will be sent east in a special sleeping car the end of July. Fifty competitors for places on the team were trying out for position today under the supervision of Lieutenant-Colonel Woolpert of Salem and Lieutenant A. A. Schwarz of Portland. Lieutenant Schwarz is a veteran of many national competitions and probably will be coach of the Oregon team.

All Oregon officers attending the 15 days of field maneuvers at this place are making their own beds, taking care of their own shoes and quarters and running their own personal chores. As a result of orders issued by Colonel George A. White, adjutant-general of Oregon, and which became effective immediately before camp, to the effect that enlisted men are not allowed to flunkify for officers under any circumstances, even if they make application for such duty. Among the objections to the practice, quoted in the order, is that it deprives the men of opportunities for strictly military instruction and is prejudicial to the best interests of the service. Those requiring personal service are advised to hire professional flunkies not belonging to the service. The order smashes a military custom that is as old as the military service itself.

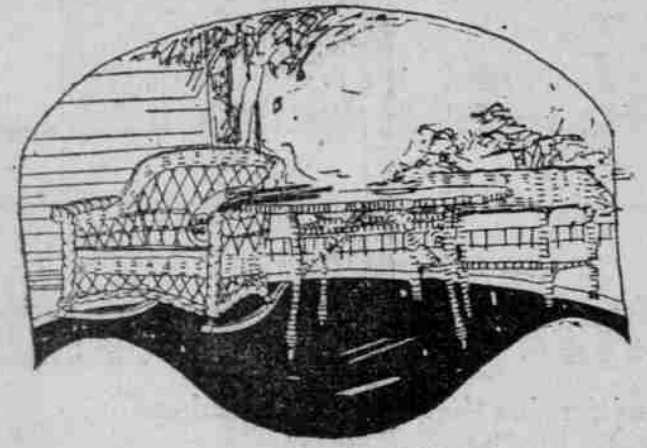

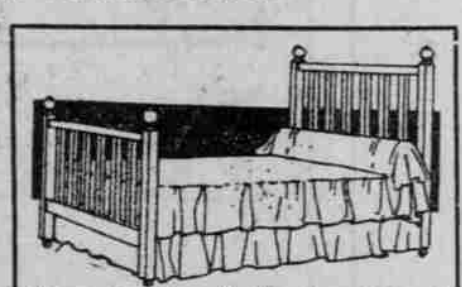

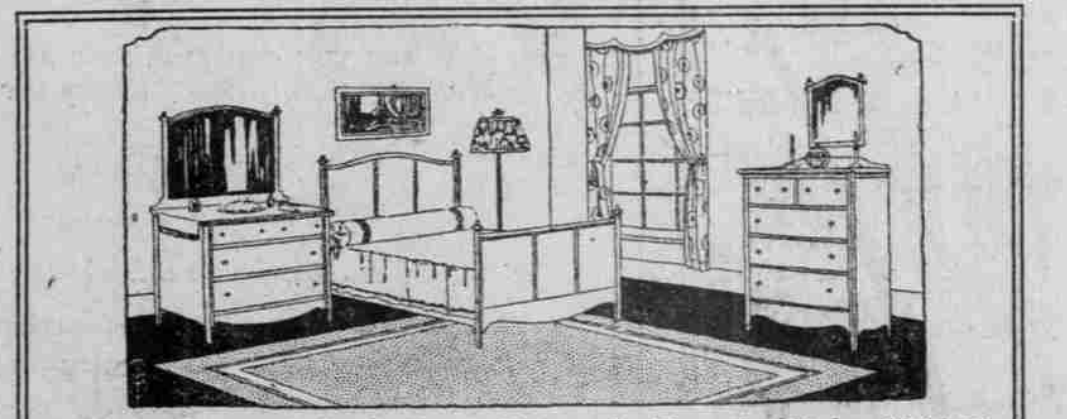
