Robinson Crusoe's Asylum May Become Playground.

Historian Suggests Island Be Made Into National Park.

H ONOLULU, T. H., July 10.—(Special)—The cave of Robinson Crusos may yet become as common a tourist magnet as Niagara Falls or the Grand Canyon now that Professor William Alanson Bryan, former mem-ber of the faculty of the University of Hawali, has suggested to the Chilean government that the island of Juan Fernandez be made a national park.

It all came about in this way. Proessor Bryan is vice-president of the Hawaiian Historical society and the prepounder of the theory that at one time there was a large continent in the there was a large continent in the Pacific. This continent sank leaving only its peaks as islands, he says. To prove his theory he had taken three years furlough for the purpose of touring the South Seas. He recently visited Easter Island and then Juan Fernandez, the latter being 390 miles off the Chilean coast. Juan Fernandez island is the one on which Alexander Selkirk was put ashore. Alexander Selkirk was put ashore. Selkirk is supposed to have been the original Robinson Crusoe and it is generally believed that his adventures and experiences resulted in Daniel Defoe's narrative.
