BRYAN EULOGIZES WATER IN HIS CONVENTION ADDRESS

Peace and Prohibition Go Hand in Hand, Says Commoner, When Urging Adoption of Five Platform Amendments.



M chairman and Members of the Convention: "Water: the daily need of every living of thing. It rises from the earth, obedient to the summons of the sun, and descends in showers of blessings. It gives of its sparkling beauty to the fragrant flower it is; it is the alchemy that transmutes base clay into golden grain; it is the canvas upon which the finger of the Infinite traces the radiant bo wof promise; it is the drink that cheers and brings no sorrow with it; Jehovah looked upon it at creating the convention of the result sullenly—just acquiesce with tears in the voice—and the proper presentation of the claims of candidates for national offices. The prohibition amendment to the national constitution was submitted in the regular way. In the senate, the resolution received five more than three-fourths of the votes, and in the house it received considerably more than two-thirds of the votes, the two leading parties casting about the same percentage of their vote for and against.

"The constitution requires that an amendment shall be ratified by three-fourths of the states; this amendment was ratified by 45 of the 48 states, nine more than the number required. (Applause.) The resolution submitting this amendment allowed seven years and one much to secure the

people. "I shall speak of prohibition again when I use the 20 minutes that I have in closing. (Applause.)
"Now, let me in a moment's time ask you to consider four other amendments, which, in my judgment, would help our party to win. help our party to win.
"The first is a national bulletin.

We have no newspapers in this country except those under private control and these are divided into two classes, namely, those that are owned by honest and patriotic men and used for a patriotic purpose and those owned by predatory corporations and used to deceive those who read their editorials and news columns. (Applause.) It is not fair that the voters should be left to the mercy either of a biased press or to be exploited by the sub-sidized papers that sell their readers at so much per head. The very best of our papers are owned and edited by men who are human and because human are biased. They cannot give both sides fairly even when they try

not try to give either side honestly The democratic party should declare that it is in favor of light rather than darkness, because its deeds are not evil.
