

SEVERE WOUNDS IN PRELIMINARY DISORDERS

Buildings Burned and Men Ambushed on Road.

GENERAL ELUDES CAPTORS

Lloyd George Threatens to Stop Railroad Operation Unless Or- ders Are Carried Out.

BELFAST, July 31.—Five soldiers and two police men were wounded and buildings were burned in disturbances reported here from various sections last night and today.

A military lorry carrying mail from Cork to Fermoy was attacked today, five soldiers being wounded by a bomb thrown from a hedge.

No arrests were made. The soldiers on the lorry were reported to have used machine guns.

The Athlone courthouse and police barracks were burned. A large creamery at Thurles was burned and two policemen wounded by explosion. Several homesteads also burned.

THURLES, County Tipperary, Ireland, July 31.—A soldier and a policeman were ambushed near Upper Church last evening, both receiving dangerous gunshot wounds.

DUBLIN, July 31.—An official and a civilian were killed and a soldier and a boy severely wounded Friday night, when a military and police party was ambushed by 50 armed men near Bruree, County Limerick.

Brigadier-General O. H. T. Lucas, commander of the Pomeroy military area, who has just reached the Tipperary military barracks, after having been held by the Sinn Féiners since he was kidnapped in June, made his escape Thursday night by removing bars from the window of his room.

Brigadier-General Lucas left today. His departure was surrounded by features in keeping with his escape, which was followed by a fight with raiders near Gola.

He traveled in a touring car escorted by two machine guns and ten men armed with rifles. An airplane acted as scout. The destination of the general was not announced, but it is reported he will go to England.

If Premier Lloyd George's threat to dismiss every man on the Irish railways unless they carry arms, ammunition, soldiers, police or anything that the government asks them to carry is enforced, there will be a railway operating in Ireland next week, according to predictions here.

A still worse case is being reported from the Irish point of view, is that the Dublin horse show, an annual event in which every Irishman is deeply interested, will either have to be canceled or become a mere parody of the usual exhibition. It has been learned that Viscount French, lord lieutenant of Ireland, will not attend.

RAILWAYS TO BE GROUPED

SMALL LINES IN ENGLAND AND WALES TO BE ABSORBED.

State to Share in Surplus Revenues and Transport Ministry to Deal With Wage Questions.

LONDON, July 31.—The government's railway programme, intended as an alternative to nationalization of the roads, which are now subsidized, provides for the formation of the railways of England and Wales into six groups, the smaller groups absorb all the smaller lines. Present shareholders are to form the majority of each board of management, but each board also is to include "members elected from and by the workers on the railways." Direct competition between groups is to be eliminated.

The government financial guarantee ceases and railway rates are to be fixed, with certain safeguards for the public, so as to produce a net revenue substantially equivalent on some pre-war basis to the net revenue of all companies absorbed in the group. The state is to take a share of the surplus revenues and use it "for light railway development."

Wages and working conditions will be dealt with by machinery set up under the control of the transport ministry. The national wages board for appeals is to represent equally railway managers, workers and users, with an independent chairman. The state will have power to insist upon standardization of rolling stock and equipment.

A seventh group will control the Scottish lines. The programme issued by Sir Eric Dunnington, minister of transport, as a white paper, will be submitted to parliament in a new transport bill. In case the amalgamation is not carried out voluntarily the government will seek to compel amalgamation within a specified time.

Sir Eric's proposals generally are received with editorial disapproval by the newspapers. The Daily News says the proposals "raise all the difficulties inherent in nationalization without conferring any of its benefits."

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FEDERATION MAY EXPAND

Establishment of Civil Service De- partment Is Proposed.

CLOUDS HAMPER AVIATORS

EDMONTON, Alberta, July 31.—Captain St. Claire Street, commander of the squadron of four American army airplanes in flight from Minicopa, N. D., to Nome, Alaska, which left here at 10:50 this morning and returned an hour later, said low visibility made rapid flight over the Rocky mountains impossible.

Low clouds hung in the path of the flyers, obscuring their course to the west.

BORAH TO BACK HARDING
