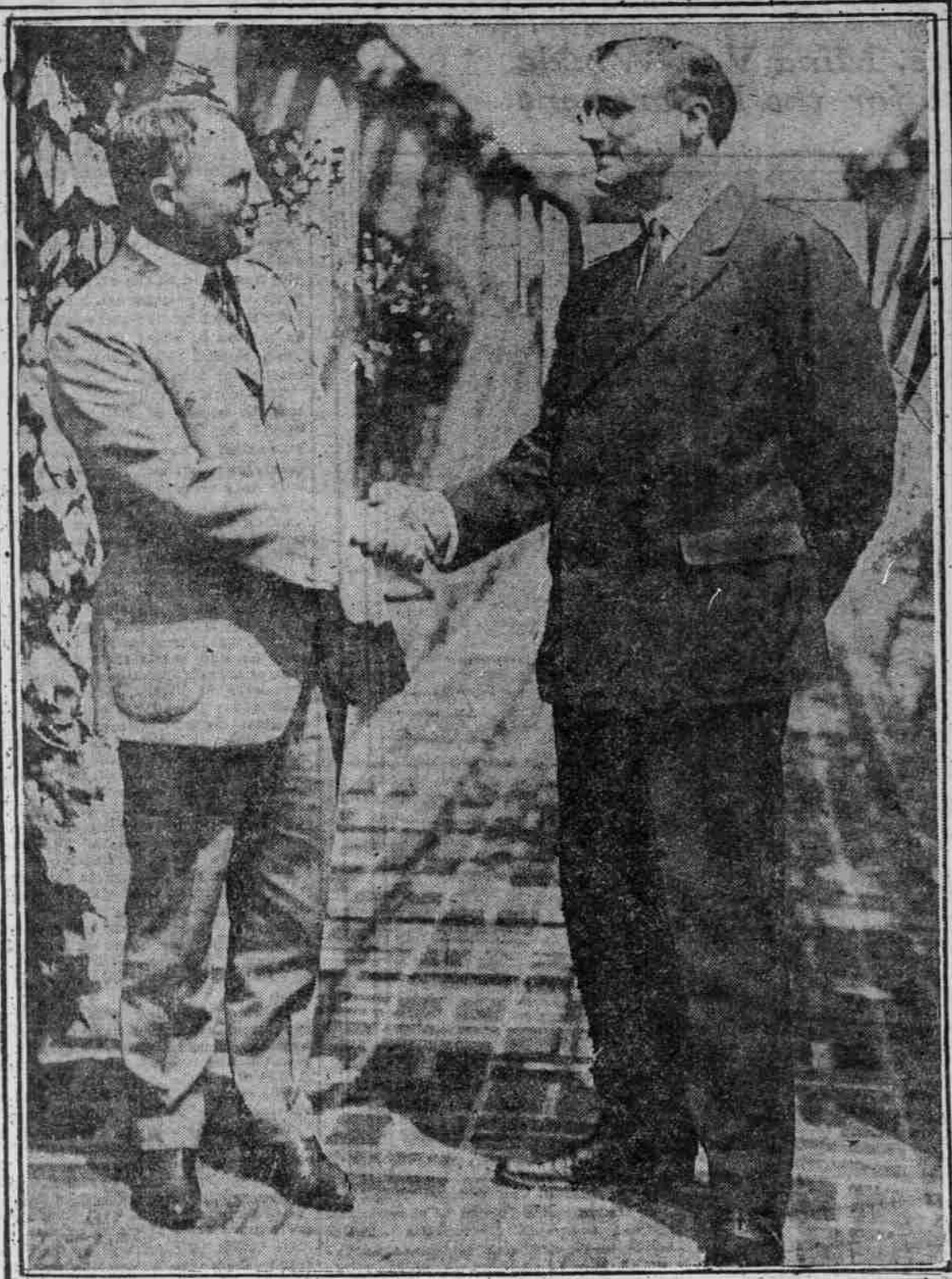


NEWS of WORLD

James M. Cox and Franklin D. Roosevelt at Columbus.
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FRANKLIN D. ROOSEVELT, assistant secretary of the navy and democratic nominee for vice-president, called on Governor James M. Cox at the governor's mansion at Columbus, O., on his way home from the San Francisco convention for a brief conference.

Senator Warren G. Harding, republican nominee for president, delivered his first speech after the convention in Washington, D. C. The precedent that a candidate remain silent until after the official notification and acceptance was not shattered, as he spoke to a graphophone. His subject was "Americanization," and the record will be widely used during the campaign.

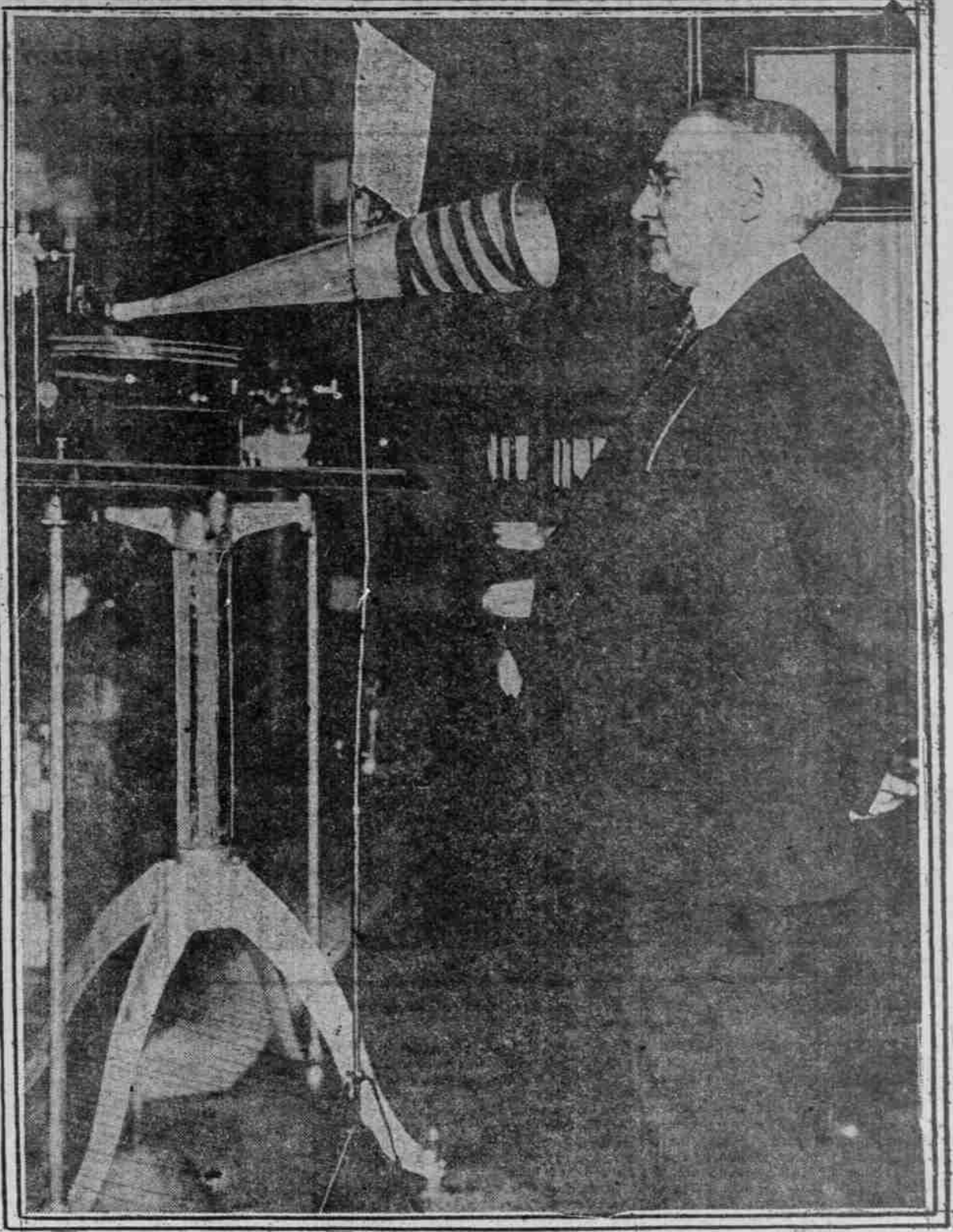

Premier Millerand of France was the center of interest at Spa, Belgium, when the conferences were held at which he prevented the Germans from securing a reduction of the coal indemnity. The fisherwomen of Boulogne presented Premier Millerand and Prime Minister Lloyd George of England with bouquets of flowers.

Lieutenant Carl Wanderer, twice decorated for bravery in the world war, has confessed to the murder of his wife and of the man whom he hired to "hold them up," so that he could shoot his wife. It is the expectation of the prosecuting attorney that the murderer will be speedily convicted and executed for his crime.

To save his wife's leg from amputation following an automobile accident, Dr. Orlando F. Scott of Chicago removed square inches of flesh from his thigh and transferred it to his wife's leg, in which skin poisoning had developed. He used his own flesh because he did not wish a stranger involved in the operation.
