Opposition to measures on the ballot in the ratios of five to one and four to one occurred in the recent election, as disclosed by the official canvass of votes in every county.

The worst defeated measure was the amendment limiting interest on losins to five per cent. Five times as many voted "no" on the amendment as voted "yes." The vote for it was 28,976 and that against it was 183,673. The majority against it was 123,673.


