

### MEDDLING BY LEAGUE TABOO, SAYS CANADA

Dominion Averse to Interference in Home Affairs.

### DELEGATE SPEAKS FOR U.S.

Tittoni of Italy Thinks Assembly's Scope in Internal Problems Open to Discussion.

GENEVA, Nov. 20.—(By the Associated Press.)—Although the United States is not represented by a delegate in the assembly of the league of nations, there is hardly a session in which the United States is not referred to. The United States today had a volunteer spokesman on the speakers' stand in N. W. Rowell of Canada, who warned the assembly against any policy involving interference in the internal affairs of any country.

"Canada," said Mr. Rowell, "will never consent to any such interference," adding: "You cannot expect the great country to the south of Canada to become a party to the league if there is any pretension that the league can interfere in its internal affairs."

Signor Tittoni of Italy, replying, regretted that the delegate took such a radical position on a subject he thought open to discussion.

Today's session concluded the first stage of the assembly's work. The agenda now is in the hands of the committees, which are expected to report early on questions susceptible of quick solution, so that the full session can act on these while committees continue their work.

The armament committee began its labors today in open session. Christian Lange of Norway and Dr. Wellington Koo of China gave a general sketch of the work. The former suggested that the only measure that could be adopted to gauge limitations on armaments was the budget.

Dr. Da Cunha of Brazil introduced a resolution providing that the manufacture of armaments and munitions be limited to state monopoly.

Go Slow, Says Koo. Dr. Koo said it was necessary to go slowly to progress surely. He said that the United States and Russia were not members of the league and that other countries which it would be necessary to consult are out of the league.

The first formal step looking toward the revision of the covenant of the league of nations was taken by the assembly of the league at today's session. The Dutch minister of foreign affairs, H. A. Van Karnebeek, introduced a resolution for reconsideration of article 18, having to do with the registration of treaties.

An international military force, with an international staff, was proposed by Senator Henri La Fontaine of the Belgium. Senator La Fontaine had somewhat startled the assembly by declaring that the world was not ready for disarmament.

"It is necessary to say frankly to the people," he said, "that the time for disarmament has not yet come." He proposed that the armaments and armies be comprised in an international force, with an international staff, ready to be used "in the cause of right," in such a case as arose from the present situation of Armenia.

QUARREL IS HELD DISTANT Lloyd George Says He Believes in Getting What He Can.

PARIS, Nov. 20.—Differences between Great Britain and France do not amount to a quarrel, and the views of these two nations have in no way prejudiced the alliance which held them together during the war, said Premier Lloyd George of Great Britain, in an interview at London yesterday with the correspondent of the Petit Parisien.

Mr. Lloyd George declared that, regarding reparations, England would stand "elbow to elbow" with France, but he insisted that the amount Germany will be called upon to pay should be fixed.

"I will tell you exactly what I think," said Mr. Lloyd George. "It is very simple—make Germany pay all she can. Yes, but how much? Have you a figure? I say the amount should be fixed.

"I was a lawyer before entering politics and when I confronted a debtor I had two courses to choose, either to enforce strictly the rights of my client and sell the debtor's house and furniture at the risk of getting nothing or next to nothing, or saying to him: 'You owe so much. How much can you pay at once? How much in a year, or in ten years?'"

### FORMAL CHARGES OF MAIL ROBBERY FILED

Five Men and One Woman Now in Custody.

### HEARING SOON EXPECTED

Belief Is That All Principals in Big Theft Near Omaha Have Been Arrested.

COUNCIL BLUFFS, Ia., Nov. 20.—Formal mail robbery charges were filed in federal court this afternoon against the five men and one woman in custody.

Merl Phillips, Orville Phillips and Fred E. Portenberger are charged with breaking, entering and robbing United States mail trains of registered mail.

Mr. and Mrs. T. D. Daly and Hugh Reed are charged with hiding stolen government property and aiding in the secretion of the stolen securities. Preliminary hearing will probably be held in one week.

A reduced force of federal officers today continued work for further evidence in the mail robbery here last Saturday night in which it is estimated that property valued at \$2,200,000 was stolen. Other officers who had been at work on the case began leaving for their homes in other cities.

One or two men, it was understood, are still sought as witnesses. Federal officers denied that they were looking for Keith Collins, a former army air service lieutenant. The officers reiterated their belief that they had arrested all the principals in the robbery and that the only thing that remained was to clear up what they referred to as "odds and ends" of the case.

A report was received here that a man said to answer the description of Collins had been arrested at Boone, Iowa, and federal authorities prepared to send a man to that place to make an investigation. Whether Collins is wanted as a witness in the case is not known, as federal authorities have not made clear just what connection, if any, he had with the case.

Some Loot Is Returned. Federal officials this afternoon informed reporters at the federal building that they had received through the mail three diamond brooches which were a part of the loot of the Burlington train robbery. The statement was made also that when Orville Phillips was arrested he turned over to the government two bonds, one issued by the City of Bordeaux, France, \$100 denomination, and one \$50 liberty bond.

OMAHA, Nov. 20.—Sheriff Hanson of Boone, Ia., in a long distance telephone conversation with the Omaha Bee shortly after noon today stated that the last arrest that had been made in Boone was made two days ago—that time a lone man was arrested for stealing coal. When given the description of Lieutenant Keith Collins, he stated that he was not the man in custody.

Mills Resume Operation. CENTRALIA, Wash., Nov. 20.—(Special.)—The Mutual mill resumed opening a shutdown for repairs. The Bucoda shingle mill started up again after a suspension due to a log shortage.

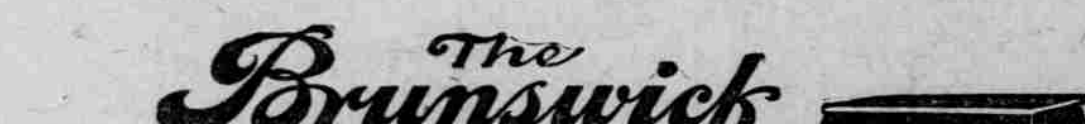

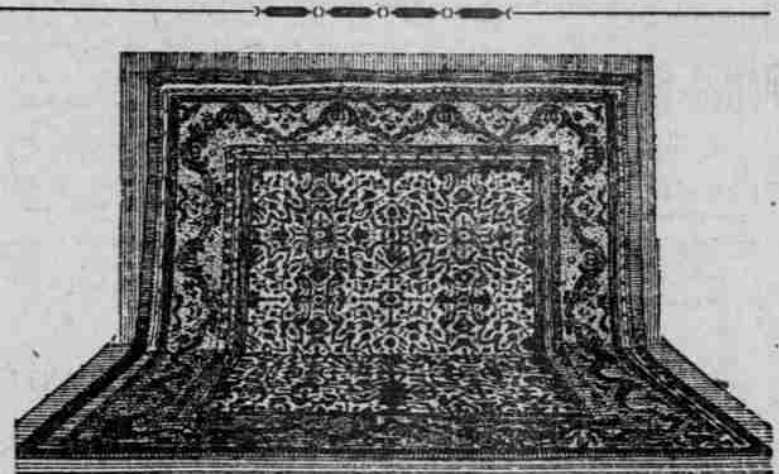
