OLDER BOYS WILL MEET. VALLEY CONFERENCE TO BE HELD IN SALEM, DEC. 10.

Large Delegations Are Expected From Several Towns and Several Speakers Are Listed.

An older boys' conference for the Willamette valley is to convene in Salem December 10, 11 and 12. Plans for entertainment of several hundred delegates have been completed. W. F. Rouse, secretary of the boys' division of the Portland Young Men's Christian association, is to accompany about 100 boys to the conference. Delegations will go from Marion county under the leadership of W. P. Walter, county secretary, and from Yamhill under the leadership of H. B. Christie, county secretary. The conference will also be elected the first day and will have charge of the following two days' sessions. Saturday morning will be taken up by short addresses and conference discussions. Recreation features will be in charge of the physical Director Osborne of the Salem association. Citizens of Salem will tender a banquet Saturday evening to boys of the conference.

George Hug, superintendent of Salem schools, is chairman of the Salem committee on arrangements. L. A. Pickett, boys' secretary of the Salem association, is receiving registration cards. A. E. Young, interstate boys' secretary, is arranging the programme and will direct the conference.

DOCTORS HEAR OF OREGON

Journal Described Mental Survey Being Conducted in State.

The Journal of the American Medical association in the issue of November 15, 1920, contains an article written by Eugene C. Nov. 20, (Special).

A campaign for cleanliness and healthfulness in the schoolrooms of the rural districts of Lane county has been inaugurated by E. J. Moore, county superintendent of schools, and J. G. Swan, county rural school supervisor.

Mr. Swan, in his travels over the county this fall, said he had found conditions in a large number of districts that should be remedied.

Mr. Moore and Mr. Swan have sent letters to the clerks of rural districts asking them to try to induce the school boards to clean up the interiors of the schoolhouses and the grounds.

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ten by Dr. Chester L. Carlisle of the United States public health service, director of the Oregon state survey of mental defect, delinquency and dependency, entitled "The Physician as a Factor in a State-Wide Co-operative Programme for Prophylaxis of Sociological Disorders."

The article outlines the origin, object and scope of the Oregon state survey, drawing attention to the state-wide citizen co-operative plan, which was carried out, and emphasizing the importance of the physician in such a campaign for the improvement of community conditions generally.

The article carries an illustration of the record cards which were used in the survey, these being unique, inasmuch as they provide that any combination of symptoms in the case of a sick, or criminal, delinquent or unsuccessful conduct in a social interpretation of the term may be shown in the case of any individual.

These record cards, together with certificate of the voluntary co-operation of all the citizens of Oregon are original with this survey, which is the first citizen co-operative movement in mental hygiene in history.
