At Lakehurst, N. J., the United States navy is constructing a huge hangar for dirigibles which it is expected will next spring house the next dirigible to cross the Atlantic, now being built in England. The hangar, now 80 per cent complete, is 800 feet long, 349 feet wide and 207 feet high and will cost \$3,700,000.

Samuel Rzeszewski, the nine-year-old Polish chess wizard, has arrived in America to match his skill against that of the best players to be found. He has defeated many of the best players in Europe. The wonderfully carved chessmen pictured on the board before him were presented to the lad by a wealthy European whom the boy defeated in a game played simultaneously with 25 opponents.

About two years ago J. M. Simmons started making ouija boards in a small room with a few dollars capital. Now he is a millionaire and known as the "ouija board king." His factory in Chicago covers 44,000 feet of space and will turn out 1,000,000 of the boards this year.

As a representative of the French government to be present at the tercentenary celebration honoring the Pilgrim Fathers, at Plymouth, Mass., General Georges Nivelle has arrived in this country. He is the French hero of Verdun.

When a big tree fell across the street at Chicago recently it struck a passing automobile, driven by Mrs. T. G. Nicholson, and every spectator thought she and the car would be crushed. Instead, there was only slight damage to the fender and one side of the car.

Milton Dana Morrill, American architect and inventor of a system of home building, has just left for France to direct reconstruction of homes and buildings on a large scale. In his system the buildings are made of concrete and it is planned to utilize the immense quantities of broken stone, brick and other debris available. His system and services are donated under auspices of the French restoration fund.

Air liners of luxurious equipment now regularly carry passengers between London and Paris on set schedules. Establishment of this service is said to have demonstrated beyond all doubt that the commercial airplane has reached the practical and useful stage.

Senor Juan Garcia Belmonte, Spain's champion bull fighter, visited New York recently while en route with his wife to Lima, Peru, where it is said he will receive \$50,000 for a single fight.

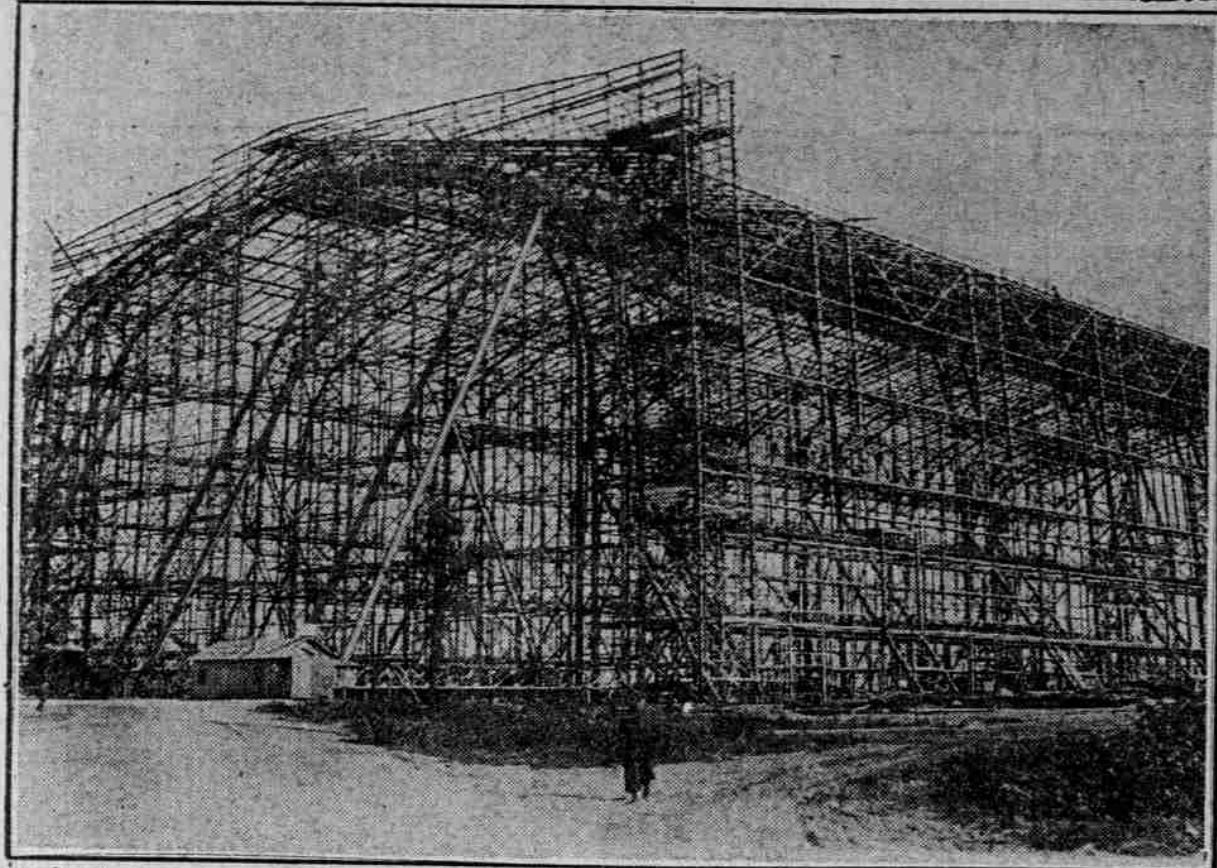

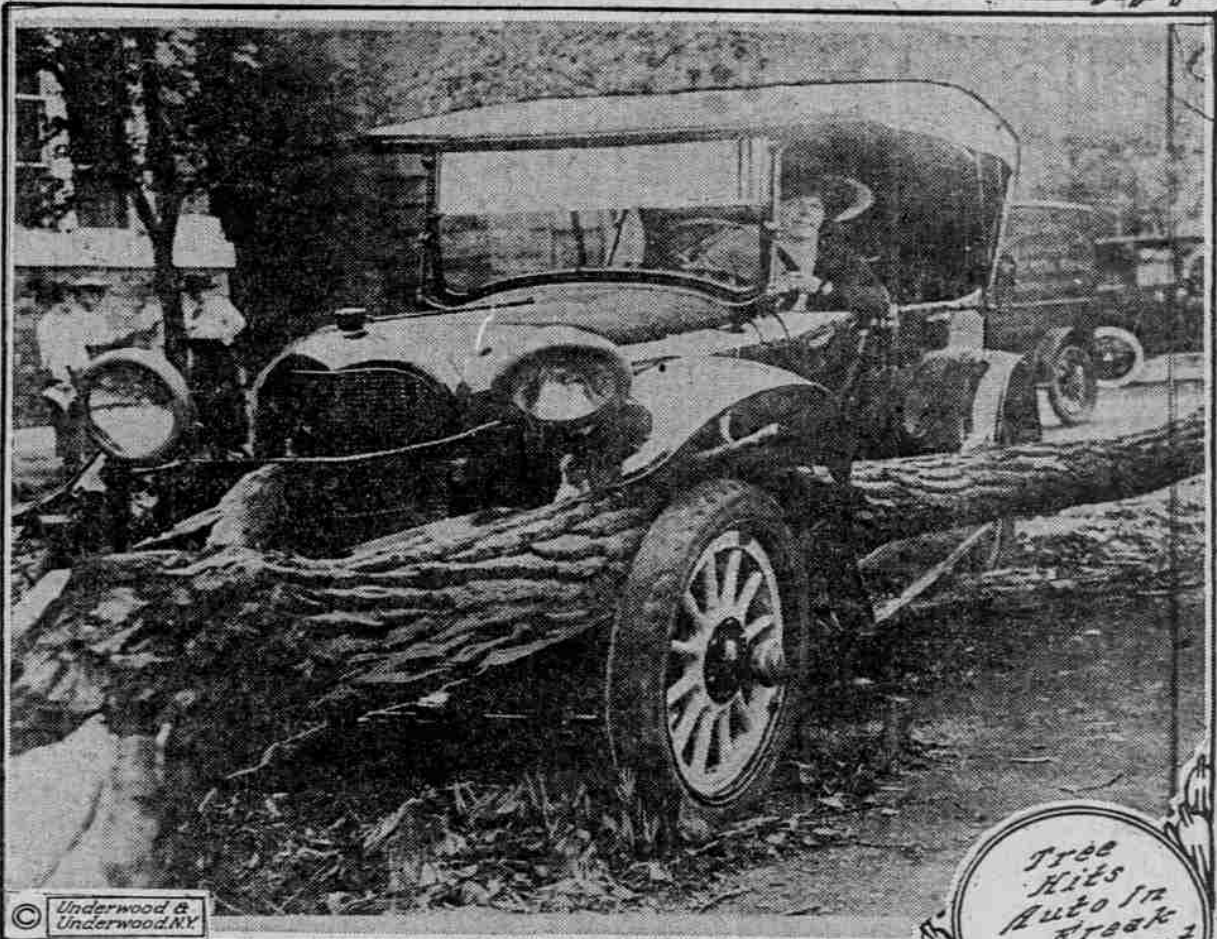
