HPI Military Academy cadet commissioned officers entertained on Thursday night at a dancing party.

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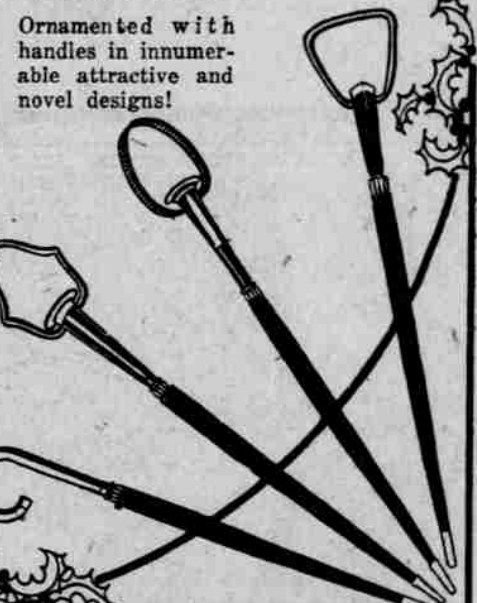
