Mr. and Mrs. Frank Cronin (Muriel Salting), formerly of Pendleton, are being congratulated on the arrival of a baby daughter.

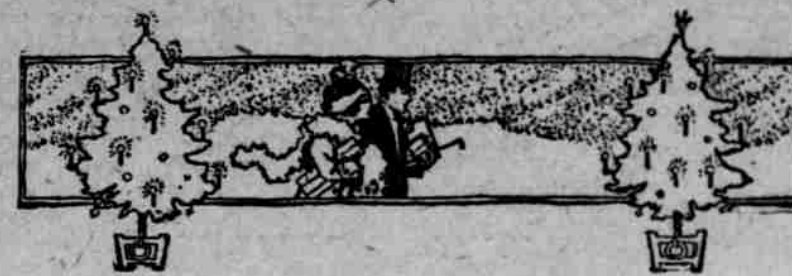
