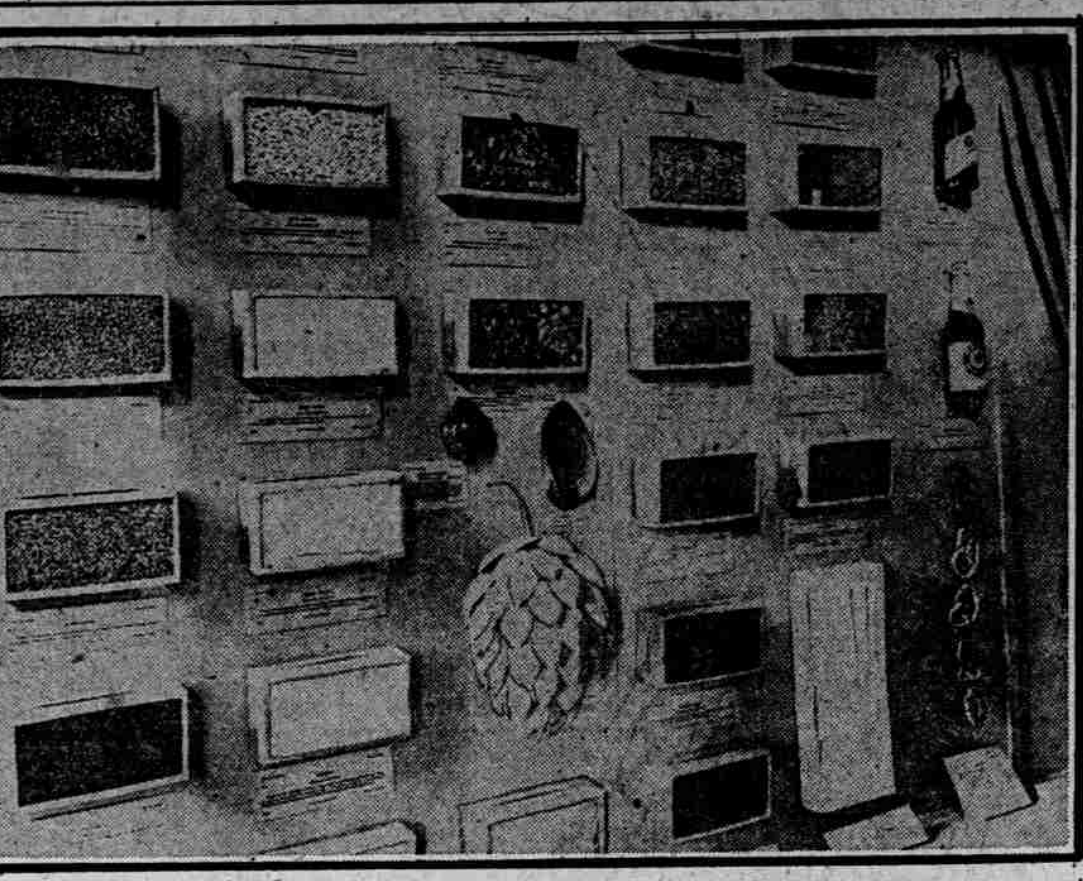
When President-elect Harding reached Newport News, Va., returning from the Panama canal zone, his boat was given a remarkable aerial and marine escort into the harbor.

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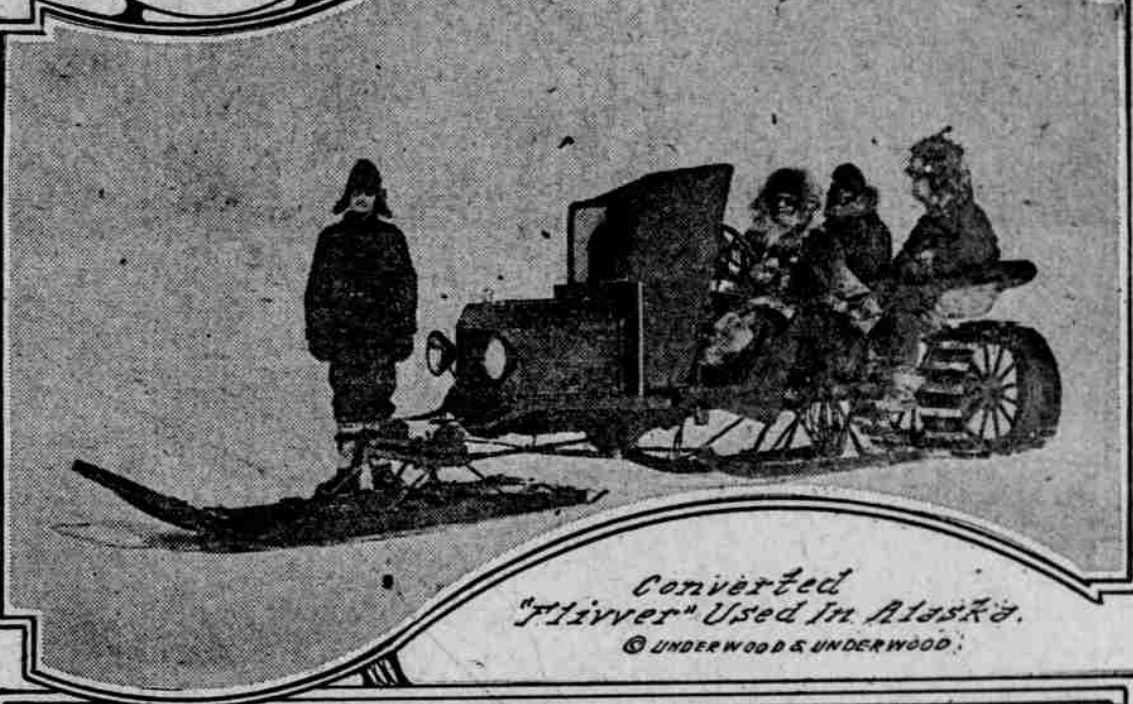

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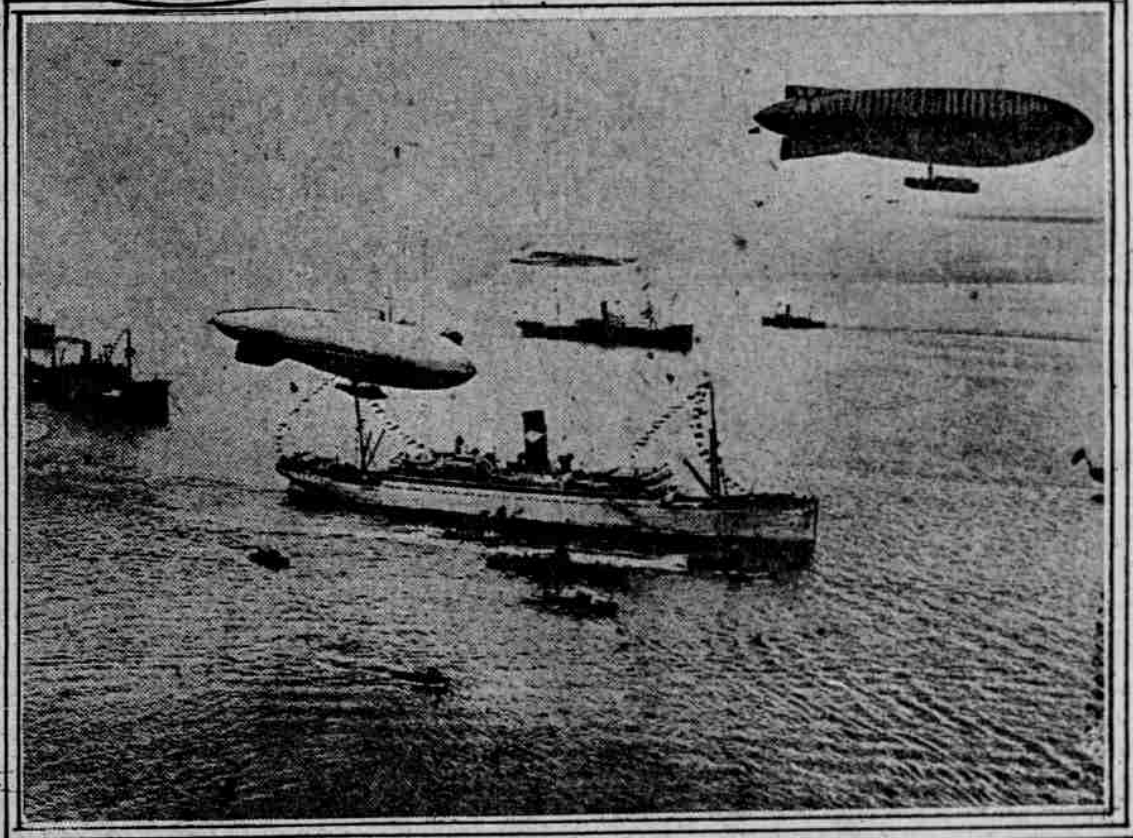

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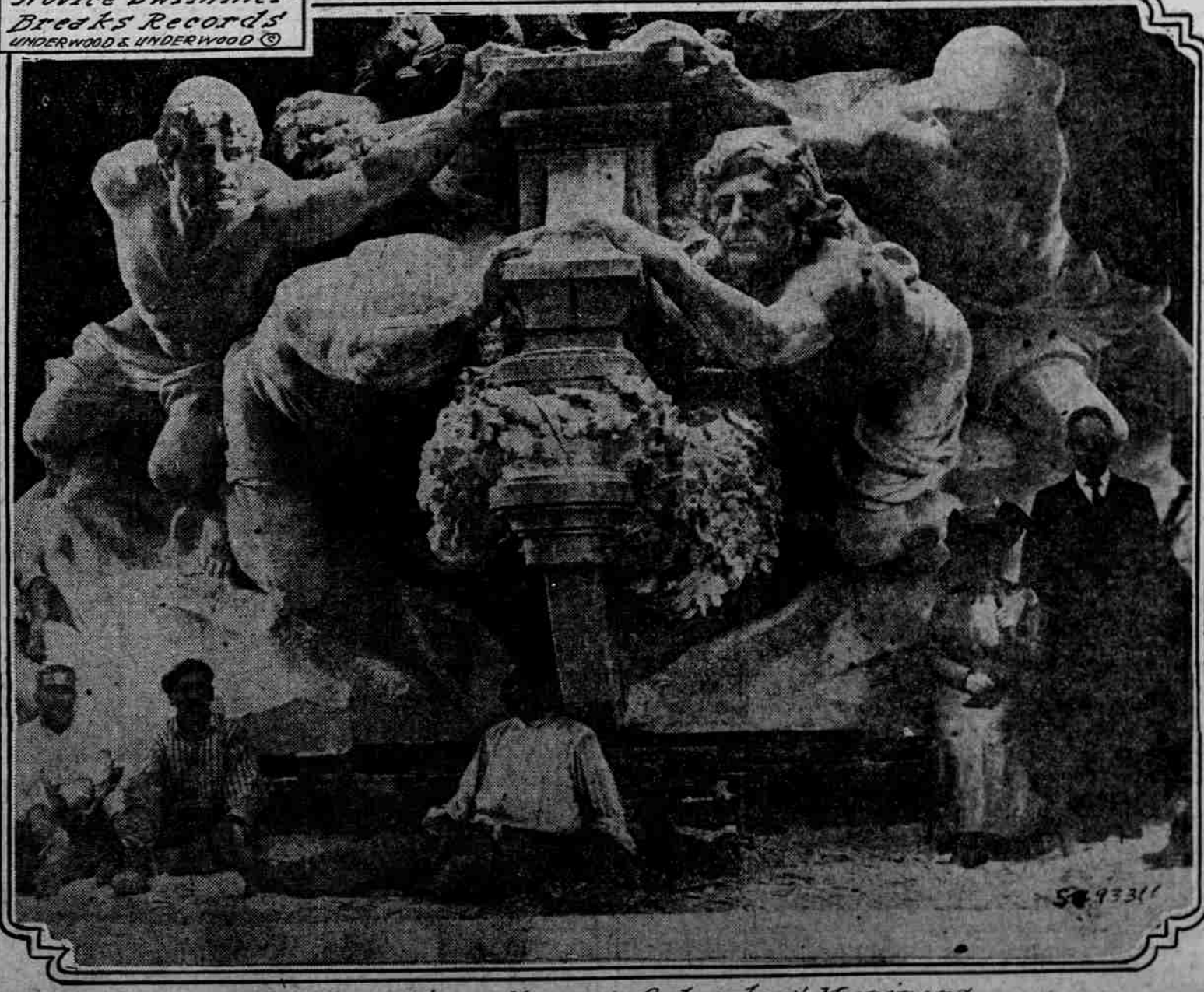
