Submission of Same Bill Repeatedly Held Pest.

SINGLE TAX IS EXAMPLE

Movement to Hold Constitutional Convention Will Be Revived at Forthcoming Session.

Submission of the same proposition to the people time after time when the people have rejected the idea will receive the attention of the legislature. The single tax proposition is the one aimed at.

Repeatedly the single tax, in various forms, has been submitted to the electorate and although it again was defeated in the November election there is a rumor that its advocates intend to present it the next time measures are on the ballot.

A number of members of the legislature are of the opinion that when a proposition has been submitted to the voters and has been rejected, it should not be brought forward again until a certain time has elapsed—many years.

There is a member of the state senate who is preparing a resolution to deal with this matter. To become effective, of course, it will have to go before the people by referendum. So many of the people have been made for against the single tax that the voters, as a whole, appear to be weary of the subject and judging from the way they have been making "No" the advocates of single tax are not making any noticeable inroads on the opposition.

Constitution Often Changed.
For a number of years there has been a desire for a constitutional convention. Heretofore it has had a cold-water reception from the public. The constitution of Oregon has been amended by the legislature and by the people through the initiative that it has the appearance of a crazy quilt to a constitutional lawyer. There are sections of the constitution which should simply be statutes instead of part of the organic law.

Anyone with a little ambition and a constitution of the state of Oregon, all that is necessary is to collect a certain number of names on an initiative petition, get the title printed on the ballot and a little agitation among the people. Of course not all of the proposed amendments meet with approval, but that is the system. Matters which should be enacted by the legislature in a brief bill have been added to the constitution as amendments to this or that article. The constitution is not a sacred document, nor is there any attempt at co-ordination of the whole, nor can there be with amendments coming every year or two.

Convention to Be Proposed.
The suggestion for a constitutional convention is promised to be presented to the 1921 session of the legislature. It probably will encounter antagonism inasmuch as it is intended to pave the way for such a convention some time in the future. A constitutional convention would try to strip the present constitution of its bare bones and segregate secondary parts of the existing patchwork to the statute books. This could be done, however, claiming that the loss of a single valuable lot of the present constitution.

In 1906 the people, by initiative, made the constitution of Oregon a constitutional convention should be referred to the people. In 1910 such a resolution was referred and was approved under a two-thirds vote of the opposition being 59.574 and the vote favorable, 23.142. That was 10 years ago, since which time a constitutional convention has not been held. Also, the politicians who were viewed with suspicion in those days have since lost all interest in the subject and there is now no semblance of a political machine, of such organization as individuals have been able to uphold for their own particular advancement.

GERMAN TRAINS ON TIME
TRAVEL CONDITIONS ALMOST BACK TO NORMAL.
Coffee and Tea Are Provided and Lunches May Be Bought From Vendors at Stations.

MUNICH, Dec. 25.—Traveling conditions within Germany are more nearly normal than in most other parts of Europe. Trains are frequent and generally on time when not compelled to wait for connections with trains from other countries. There are fewer trains to Germany than formerly. Many lines do not operate first-class sleeping cars. But most important, the German railways make such small charges that they are easier to augment than formerly. Travel to and from East Prussia is more troublesome than in any other part of the country. Most trains are delayed at least two hours by Polish officials at the Danzig corridor and frequently the delay is much longer. In the Rhine land, the train service is especially good and all hotels and pensions are extending a welcome to foreigners. For a time some hotels in Germany charged higher rates for foreigners from countries where the change was better than in Germany, especially to Americans. But this practice has been abandoned by all important hotels. Shopkeepers occasionally try to charge Americans and Englishmen more than the marked prices on their goods, but the practice has been recently so strongly rebuffed that few important concerns continue it. The attitude of the German public toward English-speaking travelers is almost universally courteous. Occasionally Germans will leave a comment when English is spoken, but the great majority of Germans seem to enjoy an opportunity to practice English and will frankly say so.

RICHEST MAN IN WORLD NOT ONE WITH MOST MONEY

Nebraska Blacksmith Writes Letter That Brings Comment From All Parts of This Country, Canada and Europe.

MAHA, Neb., Dec. 25.—(Special.)—Here's a Christmas story of the richest man in the world. He hasn't much money and he runs a little blacksmith shop in Pierce, Neb., but he has a wife, a couple of children, a good bird dog, an old shotgun, a pipe, a first-class appetite and a good digestion, and when he wrote a little letter about them a short time ago he struck a note so filled with contentment and good cheer that that letter has been copied all over the world, has been translated into a dozen different languages. Sermons have been preached on it. A hundred prominent editors have editorialized on it. Great business firms have sent it out in pamphlet form. It is on a dozen or more calendars. Embossed and embossed cards carry the hearty greeting from the newsmaster. Its contented spirit has been used as a foil to bolshevist literature. And actually thousands of people throughout the United States have been so helped and touched that they have written personal letters to the Nebraska country blacksmith, who is very little money, but who considers himself the very richest man in the world today.

Edward J. Meyers is the name of this rich man. He lives at Pierce, Neb., and he is a blacksmith. He gets more mail than half the town combined. His letters are all from strangers in name, but friends in spirit. He has received a letter from a member of the state senate who is preparing a resolution to deal with this matter. Letters Are Piling Up.
"It would take a week to run over my letters—and they are coming in at a greater rate every day," says Meyers. "It is mighty interesting to get an insight into the heart of the busy city man, the overburdened housewife, the philosopher who has passed his three score years and ten. I would not take any amount of money for the cheer and companionship and 'folksy feeling' those letters have brought me."

The letter which Meyers wrote to a small Nebraska newspaper and which hit the right spot so accurately that it has gone round the world and back, is as follows:

"I wonder if you know that one of the richest men in the world was 14 miles north of Norfolk, right here in Nebraska. The man is the writer. I am just a common 'plug blacksmith,' but oh! how rich."

"I go to my labors each morning, work until noon, go to dinner, return at 1 P. M., and work until 5 o'clock. I enjoy the greatest of all blessings, good health. Rockefeller would give me his money, but he can't have it."

"Each day sees something accomplished. Every job of work I turn out I feel I have done my customer a service worthy of my hire."

"I have a wonderful little wife. She has a wonderful little boy. I know she must be a dandy to accomplish that."

"I have a little home, a beautiful little daughter, a son growing in maturity and now in life's game for himself."

"Rich? Why, man alive, who can possibly be richer than I am?"

"Then, to add to all the above riches, I take down my old shotgun in season and ramble through fields, woods and tangle in search of the elusive cottontail, teal and mallard with my faithful old pointer at heel (now past 11 years old) and he is as happy as I when on the hunt. When I get back, oh! how good everything does taste."
