

SENATE COMMITTEE ADOPTS TARIFF BILL

Apples, Cherries and Dairy
Products Win Protection.

TEN AMENDMENTS ADDED

Sugar, Frozen Meats and Tobacco
Are Favored, While Brood Cat-
tle, Sheep Are Duty Free.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 15.—The Fordney emergency tariff bill, broadened to include practically all farm products, instead of the limited number as the measure passed the house, was approved today by the senate finance committee, which voted to report it out Monday.

Seven amendments were added, making ten in all. No provisions of the original bill, however, were removed and raised, the major products were left intact. Opponents of the bill joined with the authors of amendments and forced the acceptance of most of them despite opposition from the bill's defenders.

It was said that the democrats on the committee, except Senators Nugent of Idaho and Jones of New Mexico, stood against reporting the bill.

List of Amendments.

The amendments made a part of the measure by committee action included:

Sugar, \$2.12 the hundred pounds until the retail price reaches 19 cents a pound.

Frozen meats of all kinds, 2 cents a pound; all other meats 25 per cent ad valorem.

Apples, 30 cents a box; cherries 4 cents a pound.

Tobacco, Sumatra wrappers and fillers, \$2.85 a pound; stemmed Sumatra, \$3.50 a pound.

Dairy Products Included.

Butter and cheese and their substitutes, 8 cents a pound instead of 6 cents, provided in amendment accepted yesterday.

The length of long staple cotton on which the tariff will be effective was reduced from 1 1/2 inches to 1 1/4 inches, the duty remaining at 7 cents a pound as the bill passed the house.

Cattle and sheep were exempted from breeding purposes were exempted from the duty on imported animals.

Rice to be used in manufacture of canned goods was exempted from the tariff of 2 cents a pound levied in the house bill.

Attempts of several opponents of the bill to lead it down to amendments dealing with extraneous subjects were unsuccessful.

Lumber Under Consideration.

In its tariff revision hearings today, the house ways and means committee took up schedule D of the Underwood act, comprising wood and wood products.

John H. Kirby, Austin, Tex., president of the Southern Tariff association, asked the committee for a rate of 15 per cent ad valorem on imported lumber that would not increase the lumber cost to American consumers.

prices." To November followed a steady rise which began in 1914. It was explained, except for 2 per cent drop in the four months' period immediately after the armistice.

"The average price of food dropped nearly 12 per cent," the report said, "but the average price of potatoes dropped 63 per cent and sugar 61 per cent."

"The drop in clothing prices was more than 14 per cent, but average prices of many items fell more. Cotton yarn goods dropped 26 to 42 per cent. Hosiery, men's shirts, women's blouses, muslin underwear and men's coats fell 20 to 25 per cent. Skirts men's and women's suits and women's coats, underwear and hats decreased less than 20 per cent."

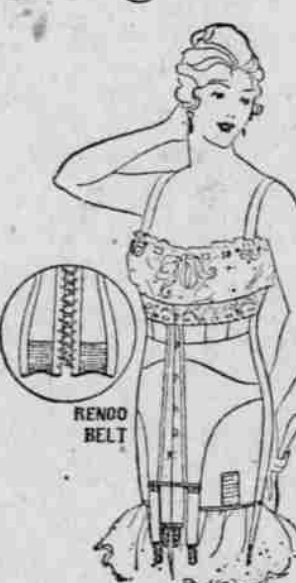
