TARGET practice and study of firearms are a matter of serious routine in the New York city police department as a step toward curbing crime. A photograph shows a group of prospective patrolmen being taught the principles of the revolver in their six-day course of intensive training.

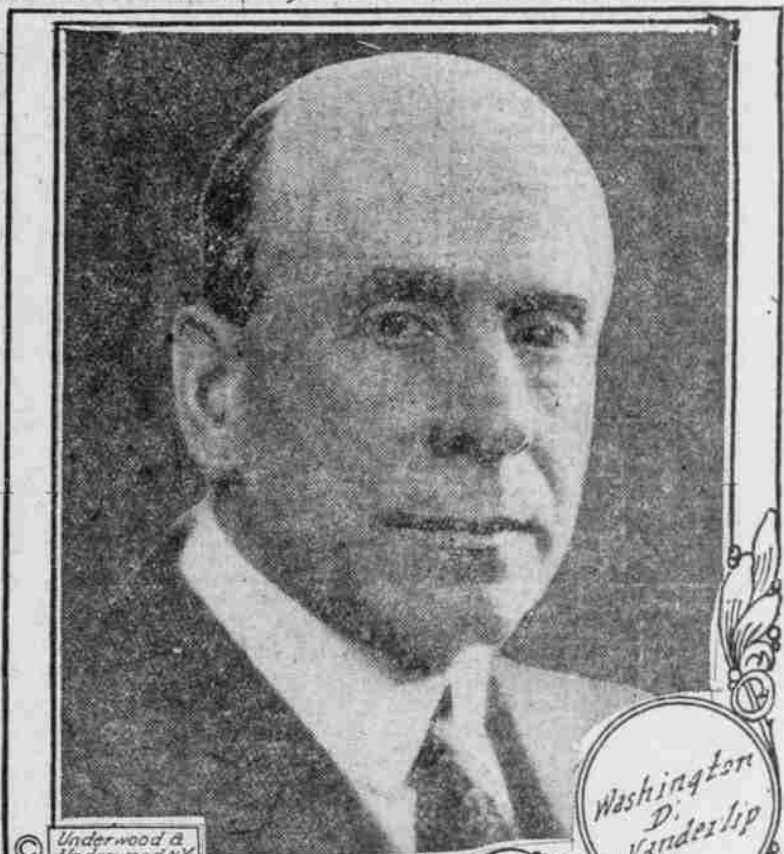

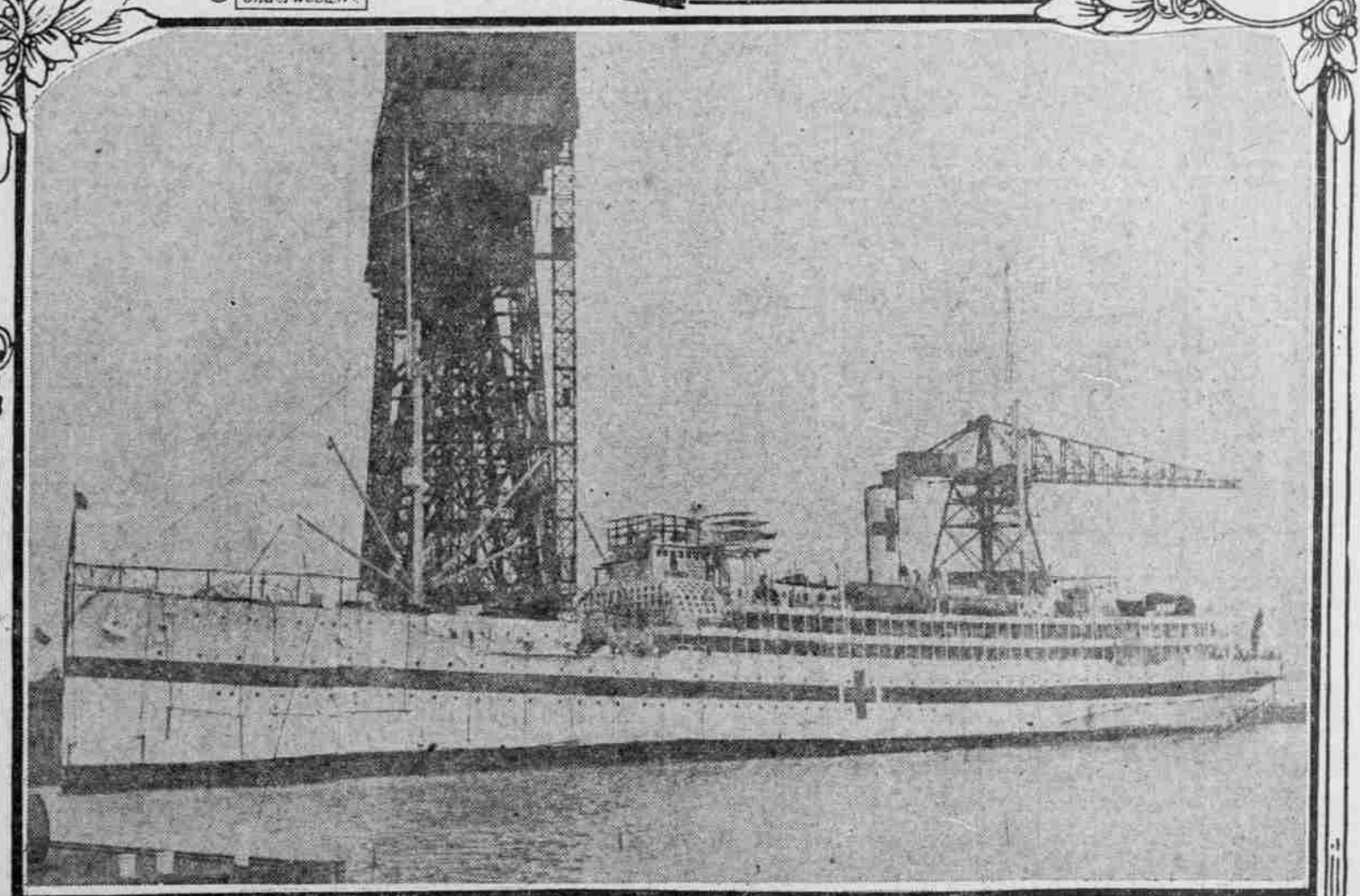
