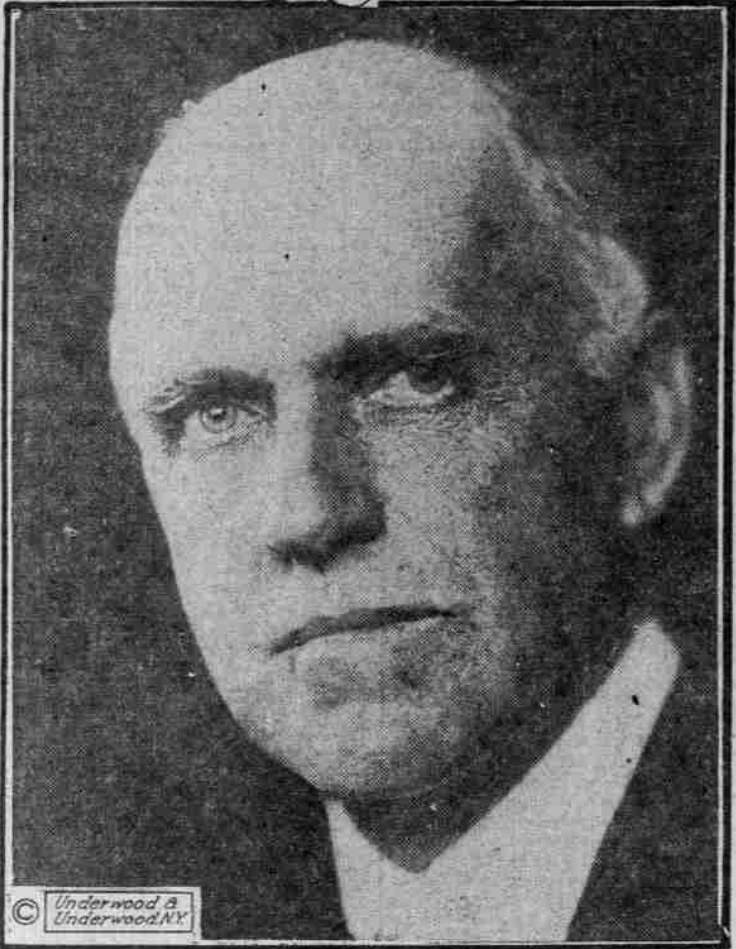


NEWS OF WORLD

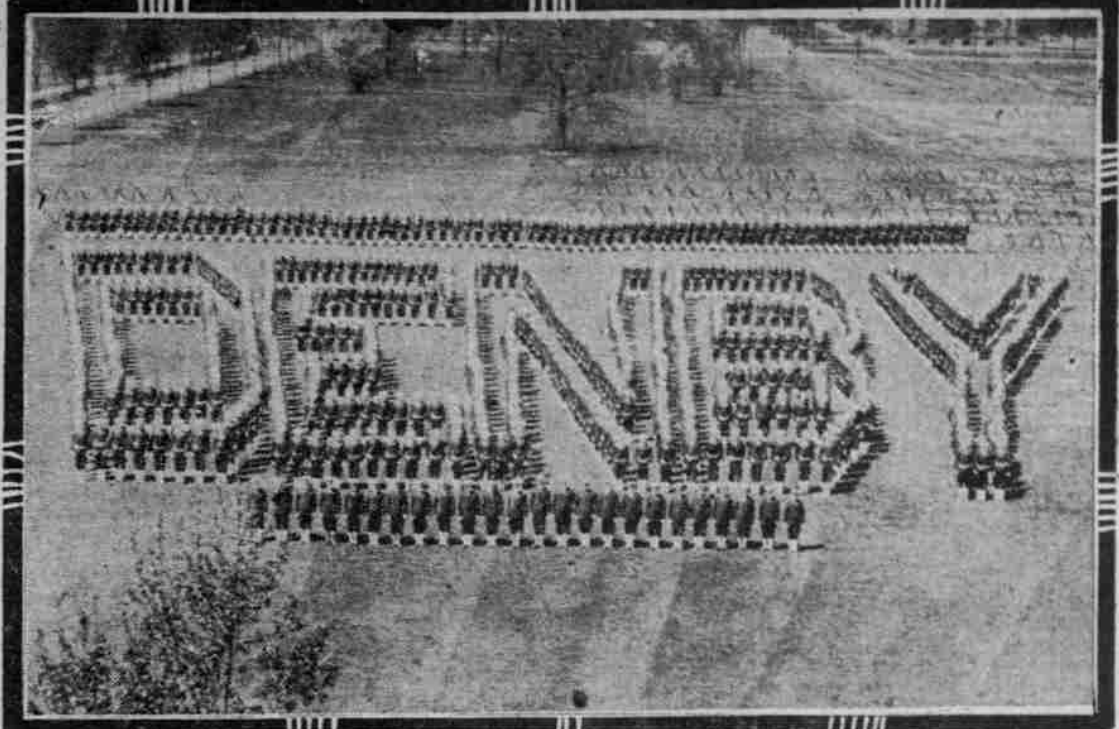

The United States government has just purchased from Italy the huge dirigible balloon, Roma, for \$200,000. The dirigible will soon be brought to this country for use by the army.



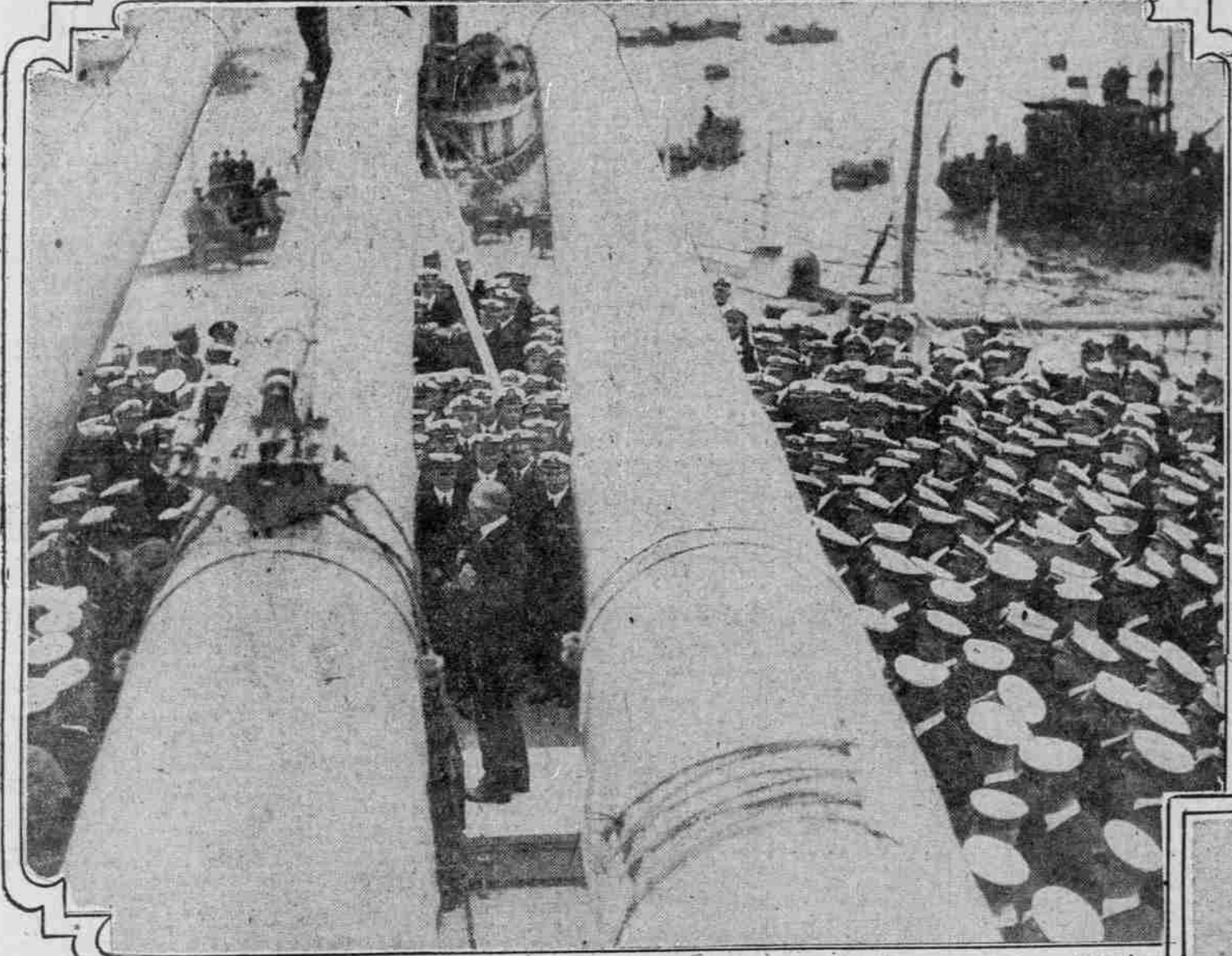
