

STEPS ARE TAKEN TO OBSERVE TRUCE

End to Hostilities is Ordered by Factious. TERMS ARE AGREED ON Government in Dublin Issues Order That All Military Activities Are to Cease.

Recognition of the Irish Republic today, the following cablegram was sent to Eamon de Valera at Valentia...

On behalf of the Irish republican army it was agreed: First—That attacks on crown forces and civilians cease.

Second—That there be no provocative displays of forces, armed or unarmed.

Third—That there be no interference with government or private property.

Fourth—That the discontinuance and prevention of any action likely to cause disturbance of the peace and which might necessitate military interference.

Development is Received Cordily by Uster Press, However.

LONDON, July 9.—(By the Associated Press.)—With something like an immense sigh of relief the entire country has greeted the news of the cessation of warfare in Ireland...

The Ulster press has received the development cordily.

For the first time in many weary months of bloody fighting, the streets of the crown were today fraternizing with Sinn Feiners in the streets of Dublin and other cities.

From isolated districts some reports came of continuing violence, but nothing of an outstanding character.

Word of the truce could hardly have been distributed to all points in Ireland so soon.

Predictions were freely made today in responsible quarters that the Irish truce would be an end to the war.

The exact date of the meeting between Premier Lloyd George and Mr. De Valera has not been settled, but no time will be lost in arranging the conversations.

Safe-conducts are being prepared for the republican leader and such of his associates as he desires to bring to London.

Just what nature the meeting of Mr. Lloyd George and Mr. De Valera will take has not been determined, but it is understood here that no objection is foreseen to others participating in the negotiations.

Premier Lloyd George will, it was authoritatively stated, accept De Valera's proposal to discuss the republican leader to discuss the basis for a formal conference.

The meeting will probably occur next week.

The Irish attorney general, Eamon de Valera had issued instructions to his supporters to cease all attacks upon crown forces and civilians and discontinue military maneuvers of all kinds.

The instructions from Mr. De Valera, the Irish office said, also were to prohibit the use of arms, to abstain from interference with public or private property and to discontinue and prevent action likely to cause disturbance of the peace which might necessitate military interference.

The instructions, it was added, were to be effective from noon on Monday.

An air of the greatest optimism this morning pervaded the premier's official residence and the Irish office, where the belief was freely voiced that there was every reason to hope the bloodshed in Ireland was nearing an end.

It was understood the details of the forthcoming conference will undoubtedly be discussed over the week-end at Chequers, court, where Mr. Lloyd George is entertaining the premier of the dominions.

Earl Middleton, south Irish unionist leader, reached London this morning from Dublin, and was almost immediately received in audience by King George. It is understood he reported to the king details of yesterday's momentous conference at which the truce was agreed.

The whole country this morning was seething with talk over peace in Ireland, which was the hope it will be possible to arrive at a solution that will be permanent.

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Mr. Lloyd George left for Chequers court today in company with General Jan Christian Smuts and other dominion premiers, who are in London to attend the imperial conference.
