Post War Paradoxes.

QUEER THINGS HAPPENING

Peace Resolution, German Trials,
British Policy and American
Thirst Confound Frenchmen.

PARIS, July 9.—(Special.)—"Amer-
ica has made peace with Germany.
When will she make it with the
allies?"

This and other half-joking, half-
bitter comments may now be heard
from the French press and individ-
uals. The signing of the Knox-Por-
ter resolution by President Harding
is not resented but is regretted, like
so many other consequences of the
Versailles negotiations.

It is no wonder then that Carpen-
tier's defeat, though a profound dis-
appointment to all Frenchmen, is
considered as having its compensa-
tions.

"At least we are spared the perils
of another war," the exclamation sums up the
attitude of many Frenchmen who have
seen French blood glistening
since the victory of Versailles.

This week in Europe has seemed
to emphasize the triumphs of the
paradox. The German general, Gen-
er, is acquitted at Leipzig. Accord-
ing to this highest court in Germany
it is not a crime in time of war to
order the killing of all prisoners and
all wounded enemies. Nursed by the
official press, the public conscience
may revolt at this for a few days
but Europe's governors inwardly ap-
prove the verdict. Otherwise few
nations that fought in the war would
be guiltless.

The American Rotarians, who are
touring Europe, are endeavoring
with much success to found branches
of their society and to promise inter-
national solidarity among traders.

The Harvard Glee club has been
visiting Paris the last few days and
American residents bent on giving
their French friends a taste of Amer-
ican campus life were flabbergasted
on hearing nothing but 15th century
chants and other high-brow stuff.
But a member of the glee club ex-
plained: "We are musicians, not
minstrels."

The French were enchanted, but
the Americans, who wanted "bulldoz-
ing on the bank and bulldozing in the
pool," or "Boeing Nettle Home," are
writing indignant letters to the Bos-
ton Transcript.

Paris meantime is emptying out.
Society, weary and worn, after a
long, hard season of operas, dinner-
dances, horse racing and teas, is de-
parting for the annual rest at Dinard
and Deauville. The chief attractions
of these resorts are dancing, horse
races, teas, dinners and operas.

"Anti-waste" continues the rally-
ing cry of British politics and some
prophets say the Lloyd George gov-
ernment will succumb before it.
They say the government's financial
incapacity is forcing the nation to
ruin. In the midst of this it so hap-
pens that an inter-armed finance
commission, largely under England's
dominance is taking charge of Ger-
man finances. "Heaven help the
Germans!" cry the British tax pay-
ers.

Here is another paradox, that
America, the great desert, may
wonder at. With all of France's
vineyards pouring forth their golden
or ruby fluids, as the case may be,
American tourists say they are
thirsty. They snuff contemptuously
at Veuve Clicquot and Three Star
Hennessy and loudly and vainly de-
mand Bourbon and English gin. Happ-
ily for them, the government is
about to lift the ban on imported al-
cohol, letting in gin and Scotch
whisky and several thousands of
American rye that has been gather-
ing dust and age in Havre ware-
houses since the Volstead law took
effect.

And finally American peace with
Germany is a paradox for the Ger-
mans. Heretofore the state depart-
ment has refused to issue passports
for hostile Germany, so the Amer-
ican went in without and now, with
peace restored, it is assumed that
passports must be amended and thus
in peace it is more difficult to enter
Germany than it was in time of
technical war.
