

AUTOMOTIVE TRADES CENTER PARKING FRAUD

Proposed 30-Minute Limit in Broadway Opposed.

DEALERS' STAND BACKED

Association Demands Convenience to Public Demands Service in Streets at Times.

The Portland Automotive Trades Association, with more than 200 members is pledged to stand behind the north Broadway automobile dealers in their fight to get a two-hour parking period for lower Broadway in place of the 30-minute limit provided in the new parking ordinance.

Public convenience demands service at the most convenient points, even if the streets are partly utilized, the dealers' statement declares. The stand is taken as a matter of principle to protect the automobile man from encroachment upon privileges that are granted other classes of business.

Public Convenience Set Up. "The principle of public convenience is recognized by every municipality," the dealers' communication pointed out. "Business houses are permitted to monopolize the streets in front of their establishments under the guise of freight entrances. Department stores are permitted to monopolize the sidewalks and congested downtown streets of Portland.

All-Day Parking Opposed. "The association further states that all-day parking allows the business folk to park their cars in front of automobile stores, and to monopolize the streets. Therefore they oppose all-day parking in the district. Thirty minutes is not sufficient for even minor repairs, and two hours is apparently the ideal time in the minds of the automobile dealers. Many of the establishments do not have room for drive-ins and must depend on the use of the streets for making minor repairs, changing tires and the like, the communication states.

Whether or not the dealers will be able to influence the council to make immediate changes in the new parking code is doubtful.

Mr. Barbur Demands Trial. Commissioner Barbur declared that the dealers should be willing to let the new restrictions be given a fair test. If it proves that the automobile men are suffering unduly from its provisions they can rest assured that the council will grant them relief. Commissioner Barbur says the traffic situation is critical, however, and all classes must be prepared to stand their ground in the face of it if it is successfully overcome.

The question is not merely that of 30-minute parking, but of the entire ordinance, in Commissioner Barbur's mind, but living up to the spirit of the ordinance in an effort to give Portland better utilization of her streets for the benefit of the public as a whole.

Two Hours Held Imposition. With two-hour parking the dealers easily can move their cars out of the way to keep within the law without improving traffic conditions in the least. The 30-minute parking is not a matter of holding a stop watch on a man and moving him out on the rim if he has not had time enough to put on a coat.

The 30-minute limit will mean that the streets will not be used for miscellaneous stop-and-go traffic purposes, Commissioner Barbur believes, but that dealers will find storage facilities elsewhere for their cars that are not needed.

Service Not to Be Hindered. The cars of the motoring public which come for service, will not be forced to double park, gain entrance to a service house, but will have opportunity to park at the curb, make reasonable repairs, if necessary, or arrange for service.

All members of the council have been made aware of the question, their stand on the Broadway question. It is probable that further investigation will be made before Wednesday.

SODA MAKER IS ACCUSED

Arrest of James H. Duncan Ordered on Adulteration Charge.

A warrant was issued yesterday by Federal Judge Wolcott for the arrest of James H. Duncan, who is charged by United States Attorney Humphreys with adulterating a beverage known as "Wine-O."

Mr. Duncan is manager of the Astoria Soda works. He is charged by government officials with having substituted saccharin and phosphoric acid for sugar and fruit juices and to have added artificial coloring unlawfully. The government stepped into the case when it was charged that the federal laws were violated by an interstate shipment of the beverage from Oregon to Washington.

Chocolate Adulteration Charged.

Three hundred pounds of chocolate coating shipped to Portland from San Francisco on steamer by the Riesenher Chocolate company has been labeled by United States Attorney Humphreys as adulterated.

The government alleges that the chocolate is not pure, charging that it has been adulterated with cocoa shells. United States Marshal Mann has been ordered to seize the shipment and if the case is prosecuted, it is probable that the hearing will be held in San Francisco.

Japanese Fisherman Fined \$25. S. Okamoto, Japanese, of Independence, paid a \$25 fine at Dallas Wednesday for angling in the waters of Lost lake without a license.

Roy Brenner of Salem, deputy game warden, made the arrest, charging the man to be without a fishing license. Okamoto was also without an alien license. The case was referred to the state game warden's office here yesterday.

TALE OF LOOTING AND MURDER IN CHINA IS RELATED IN LETTER TO PORTLANDER

Lloyd E. Gale, American Company Agent at Hankow, Declares "Whole Country Is Fast Approaching Chaos and Business Is at Standstill"—Natives Reported in Fear.

Mr. Gale, who is acting agent for the American Trading company at Hankow, China, has been in China for more than two years and writes that "the whole country is fast approaching chaos and business is at a standstill."

Hankow is just across the river from Wuchang, where half the business section was burned to the ground by looters, according to Mr. Gale's letter. "This confounded country is going from bad to worse and the natives here are living in daily fear of the looting which is just across the river from us and 20 minutes from our bank by ferry. The night they landed in Wuchang they plundered the whole city, killed many people and burned half the business section literally to the ground. We were on tenterhooks for several days, as they promised to loot Hankow the same way.

The military governor, Wang Chan Yuan, has fled from Wuchang to Hankow, where he had extorted several millions from the government to pay these and other soldiers, but upon his return it is said that he issued a proclamation to the effect that no money would be paid out by him and that all the soldiers in this division were hereby disbanded—those who had the price could go to their homes and the others could get coolie jobs or starve as they pleased.

Wreckage Is Visited. "The next day I went over to Wuchang to view the wreckage, and it is unbelievable. To save his face" the factuan wangs sent a large party of the looters up north on the railway and gave orders that an ambulance should be prepared for them at a little distance north of Hankow. This was done and when the train pulled in to the station the engine was uncoupled and ran ahead and these soldiers in the ambulance opened up on the train from all sides with machine guns and killed every man, woman and child on it—nearly 1600 of them. The loot

was then brought back to Hankow and sent over to Wuchang, where it will (not?) be returned to the looted shopkeepers.

"One of the missionaries of Wuchang climbed over the city wall of Hankow and reported that he had seen the looters at the city gates, and he borrowed my camera to take some pictures with a view to showing the world. Anyone caught with looted goods in his possession was executed in the streets forthwith and for several days the streets were full of bodies and heads were hung over all the city gates.

"The worst of it is that there are a bunch of looters still in the city barracks who refuse to surrender to the factuan, and in addition they swear vengeance on the factuan for the slaughter of their comrades at Siao Shan railway station. In addition to this the Hankow Chinese chamber of commerce is busy making donations to the troops stationed in Hankow to keep them from looting Hankow, as Hankow would be the richest pickings in the whole Yangtze valley."

SEA LION MENACE IS UNDECEASED

Wholesale Slaughter Is Declared Unwarranted.

FINLEY GIVES HIS VIEWS

Ex-State Game Warden and Biologist Challenges Statement Made by Gold Beach Man.

Statements made recently by W. M. Hunter of Gold Beach, Or., that seals and sea lions along the Oregon coast are such a menace to the salmon industry that wholesale slaughter of the mammals is warranted, have been branded as absurd by William L. Finley, a body working for the protection of harmless birds and animals.

"The statement that 1,840,000 salmon are eaten each season by sea lions along the Oregon coast is absurd and not based on facts," said Mr. Finley. "It has likely been given out to minimize the inroads that are being made upon the salmon runs by the predatory trap men and fishermen. By making people believe that a few colonies of sea lions along the Oregon coast are doing more damage than the Sacramento river. The fishermen at Monterey bay had the same complaint. The California fish and game commission sent the late Professor L. L. Dyche to make an investigation of the salmon runs at Monterey. He found no trace of fish in any of the traps set for sea lions, but he found largely on squid or octopus. The sea lions on the rocks opposite the Cliff Hotel near the entrance of San Francisco Bay have always been a great attraction. "Many of the commercial fishermen do not distinguish between the two sea mammals, the seal and the sea lion. The latter, I believe, is more destructive, as they frequently prey on the rivers and bays and multiply a salmon that has been caught and held in a net. An investigation of this kind should be carried on by some of the scientists of the United States fish commission, rather than by commercial fishermen or by politicians."

"Inasmuch as the Oregon fish commission has hired a sea lion hunter to destroy the sea lions off the Oregon coast, it is likely that before the work is completed the sea lions will be exterminated. The bureau of biological survey of the fish commission or any of its employees should be ordered to make a federal law if they kill any of the sea lions on Three Arch Rocks reservation of the Oregon coast."

Hamilton Herd of Nearly 60 Head Represents Biggest Livestock Transaction of Year.

CHEHALIS, Wash., July 23.—(Special.)—With gross total receipts of \$11,110, the dispersal sale of the Hamilton Brothers' herd of nearly 60 head of purebred Holstein cattle at the Brady farm near Satsop yesterday was the biggest sale of livestock in the west in the sale of livestock for 1921.

The top price, paid for the heifer Chalmacum Lutcke Marie, a 2-year-old, was \$745, by William Bishop of Chalmacum. For one of these, dropped May 19, 1920, Senator Bishop paid \$375; for the other, born June 17, 1921, he paid \$335.

One of the largest individual purchasers was the Taraniki Holstein company, Bremerton, Wash., composed of E. F. Benson, former Washington commissioner of agriculture; Edgar O. Fawcett, and others.
