Inactivity Not Grounds to Refuse Permit to Operate.

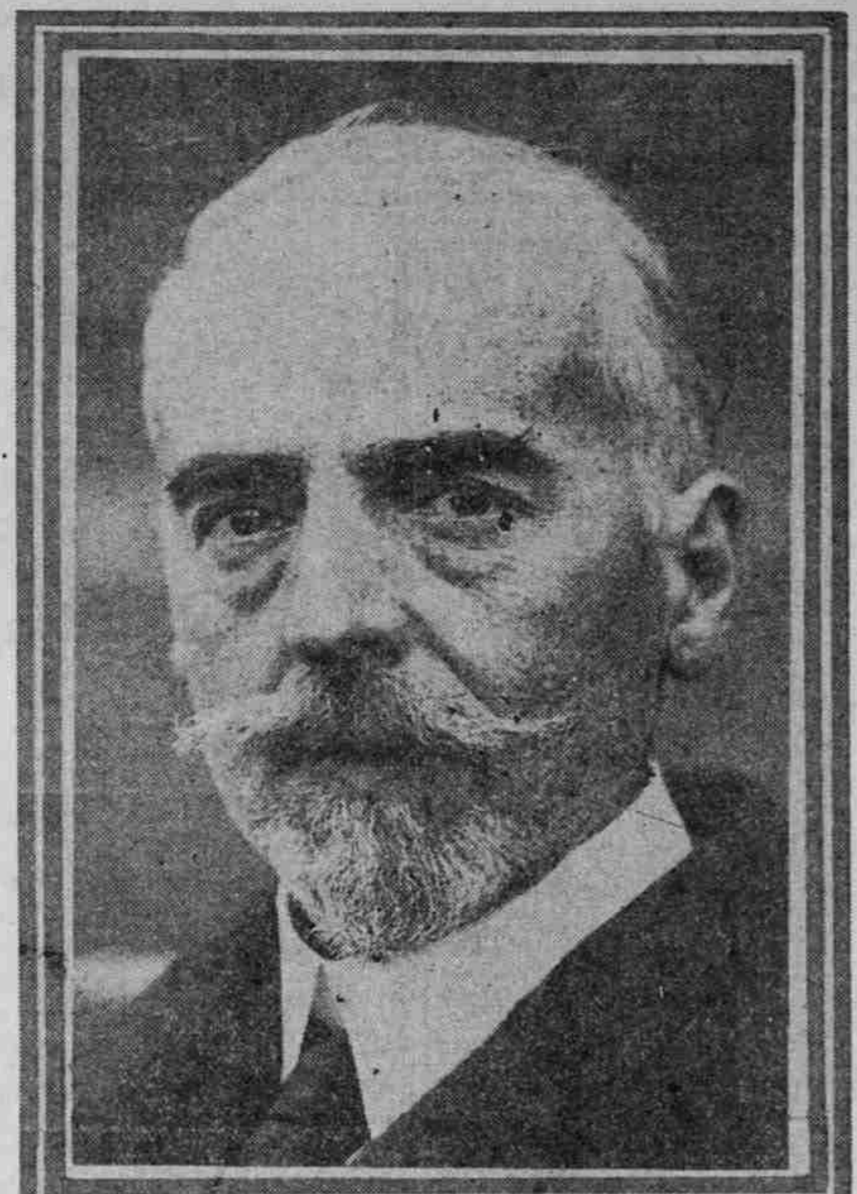

WAR RECORD IMPRESSIVE

American Military Attache Who Was in Italy During War Sings Praises of Famed Soldier.

Much of the credit for the great victories of the Italian army which resulted in the entire defeat of the Austrian forces on the Italian front in the recent war is given by C. A. Robertson, chief of staff of the Italian army, who will be in Portland Wednesday and Thursday.

Mr. Robertson was assistant military attache in Italy during the days preceding the final defeat of the Austrians and he had a chance to see at close hand the work of General Badoglio.

"There are men who unconsciously live their lives as though it were pre-arranged that their every act should be a precept and an encouragement to all others and who never concede to themselves the momentary feeling of the least cessation of fervor," said Mr. Robertson in speaking of the famous Italian general and patriot.

"One of these rare men is Pietro Badoglio, chief of staff of that valiant Italian army which sent staggering the Austrians before it in the great battle which ended in the armistice on the Italian front November 4, 1918.

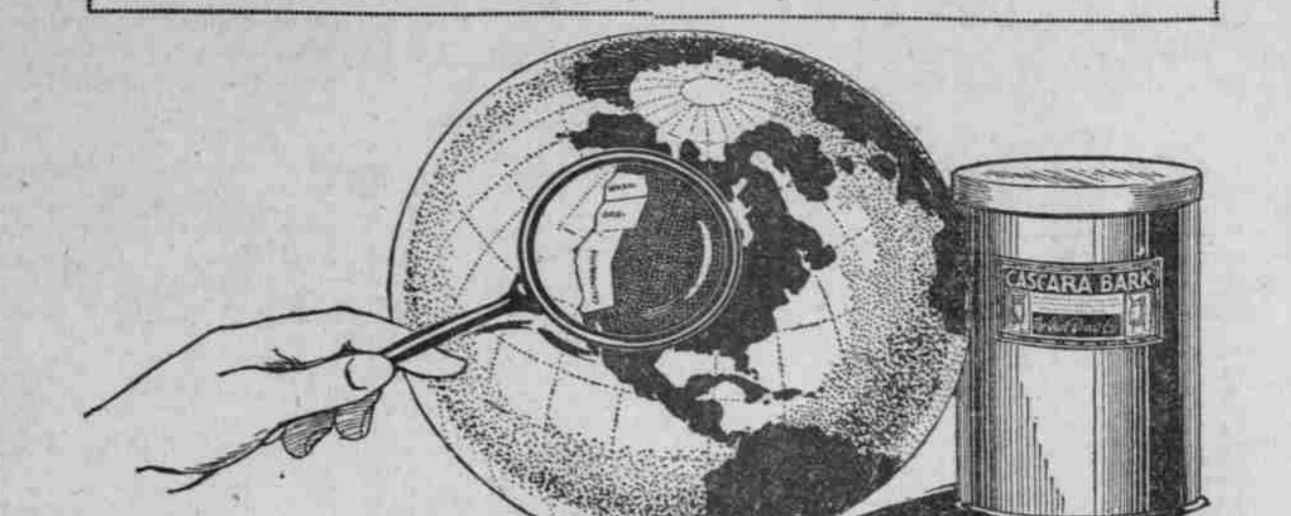
Commissioners Brown and Butler Win Fight for Progress With Backing of City.
