COMPACT FOR 10 YEARS

Four Powers Are to Respect Island Possessions of Each Other.

Lodge Reads Text.

Senator Lodge's address was delivered with an emphasis which kept delegates and spectators hanging on his every word. Rene Viviani, minister of France, voicing the devotion of his government to peace and concord, rose to passagess an eloquent speech...

Treaty Is Concluded.

"Have determined to conclude a treaty to this effect and have appointed as their plenipotentiaries: The president of the United States of America, the king of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the emperor of Japan."

China Is Not Affected.

In outlining the scope of the four-power agreement, the speakers emphasized that it is to apply only to the Pacific islands and in no way to China or any other part of the Asiatic mainland.

Frank Exchanges Required.

TREATY CONSIDERED ONLY GREAT OMEN

Bigger Things to Come Out of Alliance, Says Writer.

PACT MAKES ALL HAPPY

Vital Questions of Pacific Are Not Touched On, But Moral Effect Is There.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Dec. 10.—(Special.)—What we had this morning is not a great treaty. It is only great as a dramatic curtain-raiser to a gigantic world drama.

Never mind the treaty. What is important is in the very fact that these highly powers—America, Great Britain, France and Japan—can and did come together in a treaty binding them to work together.

France's Sufferings Related. Mr. Viviani pointed out the sufferings of his people in the war to emphasize the national devotion to instruments of peace.

Turning to the Anglo-Japanese alliance, Mr. Balfour declared Great Britain was well aware of the suspicion in America because the two-power arrangement had been continued after causes for it had disappeared in the collapse of Germany and Russia.

"All Japan," Prince Tokuzawa said, would likewise rejoice over the new arrangement, although, he added, the Japanese reciprocated the British expressions of appreciation over results of the old alliance.
