hair all across the top of the head, another part, the hair that hangs down directly at the back, and the other two parts, soft locks at the sides. First, the back part must be tightly rolled and coiled close to the head. Then the right side is drawn around loosely and rolled and pinned. Then the top part is drawn back and pinned in place. And finally the left side is rolled and pinned over all in a neat finish.

Now comes a most important item of the correct French twist coiffure; the hair-net. The net should be big enough to go loosely and softly over the hair, not pressing it down or flattening it. If correctly arranged, one hairpin will hold it at the back, near the neck; but a few invisible hairpins may be thrust in here and there if preferred. Only a single-mesh hairnet will give a dainty, soft outline to the head and no other sort should be used when a pretty coiffure is desired. The double-hairnets are useful for horseback riding or strenuous sports, but they give a hard outline to the head, which is never graceful or becoming with dainty frocks.

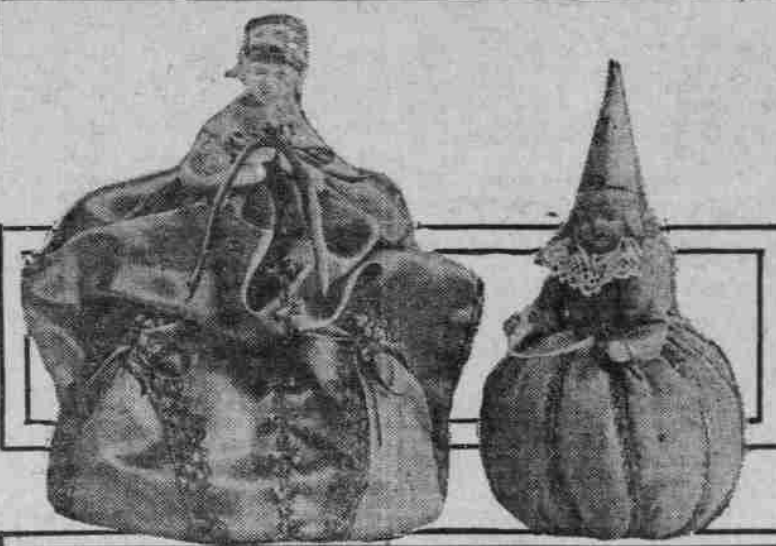

Kansas Twins Claim to Be Oldest in United States.

James and Joel Chestwood Celebrated 90th Birthday.

HAVERHORTH, Kan., April 15.—Friends of James and Joel Chestwood, twins who celebrated their 90th birthday anniversary last October 11 on the farm of the former near here, are prone to dispute the claim of the Woodville, O. twins, William H. Sr. and Henry Barnes, to the title of "oldest living twins in the United States," at the age of 88.

The recipe for long life of the Kansas twins is similar to that of the Ohioans—"work." Each of the Chestwood twins owns a farm and works on it daily, still being able to keep pace with a farm worker "three-score and ten" years their junior. Pleas of relatives for the twins to retire always have provoked a protest: "Our chief enjoyment in life is working on our farms. If we hadn't kept busy all these years we probably would have died long ago." At a party given by the twins on their 90th birthday, Jim remarked: "I'm going to keep right on working and whitening my hair as long as I can." So striking is the resemblance between the Chestwoods and the Ohioans that when they don their "Sunday clothes" and have their beards trimmed it is difficult to tell them apart. Like the Bruns twins, the Chestwoods also are pioneers, having settled in Kansas in the late '30s. For 42 years they have lived on the farms they now occupy.

Housewives to Get Prizes.

LONDON.—Women of Leyton, England, will receive prizes of £5 each for the cleanest and best-kept houses in that district by the will of Edward J. Davis, an educator, who has just died there. Mr. Davis bequeathed £1000, the income of which is to be divided annually in £5 prizes to widows, wives or spinsters whose homes are neatest.
