

AUTOPSY OF MURDER VICTIM IS ORDERED

Death Cause of Girl Found in Parsonage Is Objective.

ANALYSIS TO BE MADE

Confessed Father of Unborn Child Subjected to 36-Hour Grilling; Mystery to Be Penetrated.

DANVILLE, Ill., April 29.—(By the Associated Press.)—John L. Lewman, state's attorney, tonight ordered an autopsy of the stomach of Gertrude Hanna, victim of Hoopeson's parsonage murder, in an effort to determine the means by which the girl met her death.

At the same time Sheriff Knox advised that matters had begun to clear somewhat for John C. Wyman, Gertrude's former sweetheart, who was subjected to a severe 36-hour grilling by the authorities at Hoopeson.

Wyman is still under surveillance, Sheriff Knox said.

The confessed father of Miss Hanna's unborn child, Wyman, the authorities believe, can shed considerable light on the baffling case.

Mystery to Be Penetrated.

Strengthening of Wyman's alibi has only spurred Vermillion county authorities with determination to penetrate the maze of mystery surrounding the girl's death, State's Attorney Lewman declared.

Dr. A. C. Fisher, county physician, expected to leave tonight for Chicago, where the stomach analysis will be made. The stomach has been in his possession since last Thursday, immediately following discovery of the body in the untenanted parsonage of the Hoopeson United Presbyterian church.

Upon the result of the stomach's autopsy will probably depend the next step in the investigation, the Vermillion county prosecutor continued. The murder probe uncovered some new important developments today.

The cause of Miss Hanna's death remained as much of a mystery tonight as the identity of the murderer. Several theories had supporters among county authorities and the public.

Girl Classified as Paranoid.

It developed at Chicago that the young woman in 1917 was classified in the Cook county psychopathic hospital as a paranoid.

Her hands were folded across the chest when her body was found in the parsonage basement. It was first thought her wrists bore indications of having been tied, but Dr. Fisher said later there was no positive proof.

The lungs were said to have been in good condition, although later asphyxiation by a drug or by having smothered to death by a blanket over the head were remarked on by the doctor as possibilities.

The young woman disappeared March 21. Examining physicians were undecided as to the length of time she had been dead, but it was estimated the period was from a week to two weeks.

CASHIERS ARE DEFRAUDED

Man Gives Worthless Envelope and Takes Away Cash.

A novel method of theft, politely referred to by the inspectors of police as "short-changing," was used last night to obtain entrance to the Mill of the Broadway Hazelwood and the Millionaires club cafeteria, downtown establishments, each place losing about \$20.

At the former place a dark, handsome man of 5 feet six inches, 35 years old, neat and wearing a dark suit, brown overcoat and black fedora hat, entered and purchased 15 cents' worth of candy. The attendant, Miss Patricia Asbahr, who waited upon him, an envelope which he asserted contained \$20. She had placed the \$20 change on the counter before he noticed that it was not a \$20 bill he proffered. Before she could prevent him, the fellow grabbed the money from the counter and left her the envelope which contained a few blank sheets of paper and was addressed to some fictitious name.

Practically the same trick was worked on Miss Letta Beatty, cashier at the Millionaires' club half an hour later. She saw police descriptions similar to that given by Miss Asbahr. Her work was further identified as that of one named identical handwriting on the envelopes.

PATAGONIAN HUNT HALTED

Search for Plesiosaurus in Far South for Time Abandoned.

Buenos Aires, April 29.—Search for the plesiosaurus in the wilds of Patagonia having proved fruitless, the expedition which set out from Buenos Aires has decided to return. This is the note known dispatches from Buenos Aires which are confirmed by Professor Clement Onelli, director of the Buenos Aires museum. He explains, however, that the return of the expedition is necessary on account of the approaching winter.

Hope has been given up of finding the monster.

CHINESE IN BIG BATTLE

(Continued From First Page.) number of guards at all the legations is about 1000.

Guards Reported Reinforced.

Advices from Tsin Tao and Changtung reported that the Japanese are reinforcing their guards along the Peking railway. These had recently been decreased in number as a result of the Washington conference. The American consul at Nanking has reported that two Chinese officers in the outlying districts were observed in Peking last night when thousands of natives entered the western and southern gates, carrying their valuables to safety. All kinds of vehicles came in loaded with goods and accompanied by women and children. Inside the gates the Chinese sent their money and jewels to the banks. The firing diminished when darkness fell.

Wounded Sent to Peking.

Wounded troops from the front began arriving in the city yesterday afternoon.

During Friday night sounds of intermittent firing came from the front but with the dawn a brisk cannonade began, the city rousing to the mounting sound. Some Americans ventured out to the race track west of Peking, where they saw Chang Tso-Lin's troops directing artillery fire from the hills.

Both Chang Tso-Lin and Wu Pei-Fu have apparently warned their forces to avoid approaching the city on account of warning of the legation, and they would not tolerate disorder in Peking. The government is prepared to close the city gates at any moment, but this has so far not been deemed necessary.

Hostilities Are Lamented.

The members of the government, headed by Hsu Shih-Chang are as one in lamenting the hostilities. The president declares he will remain neutral and acting Premier Chou Tsou-Chi says that efforts to prevent civil war are being continued.

Foreign observers report that Wu Pei-Fu is attempting to turn the right flank of Chang Tso-Lin's troops by wedging in between the latter's front and Peking. Feng Yuh-siang, known as the "Christian general" is in command of Wu Pei-Fu's operations near Peking.

A Peking dispatch to the Associated Press, received late last night, but under today's date, owing to the time difference of 12 hours, said fighting had begun at dawn at Changsin, 12 miles southwest of Peking, and that heavy artillery fighting was audible in the capital.

The Peking-Tientsin railway connects Peking with Taku, her seaport, and the allied diplomats recently served notice on the Chinese northern government that this line of communication must be kept open as a means of safe egress for the foreigners in Peking should the capital be menaced by the forces of Wu Pei-Fu.

PEACE CONFERENCE AT DUBLIN SPLITS UP

No Agreement Is Reached After Three-Hour Session.

FAILURE IS REGRETTED

Horror Is Expressed at Recent Murders in County Cork, Which Are Held Unprecedented.

DUBLIN, April 29.—(By the Associated Press.)—The peace conference called by Lord Mayor O'Neill of Dublin held another meeting here today, but after a three-hour session it dissolved without any agreement having been reached.

An official statement said it was regretted that no basis of agreement had been found and that no useful purpose could be served by prolonging the conference.

The following resolution was proposed by all the participants:

"The conference expresses horror at the recent murders in County Cork. These murders are unprecedented and are thoroughly alien to Irish character, and it is the duty of all good citizens to assist in the apprehension of murderers as well as in the prevention of similar occurrences."

A statement by Arthur Griffith and Michael Collins after the meeting said the opposition broke down the conference by refusing all the provisional government's demands.

BIRTHDAY OF VIOLINIST IS OBSERVED ON LINER.

Phonograph Record in Which Two Children of Artist Take Part Is Played on Boat.

OREGON CITY, Or., April 29.—(Special.)—The birthday anniversary of Emanuel Zimbalist, famous violinist and husband of Alma Gluck, singer, was celebrated at sea on April 9, in a manner that will long be remembered by the musician. Zimbalist, a passenger on the steamship Keystone State, now on her way to Manila, was taken by surprise when a record was played on the violinist's birthday.

The title of the song was "Happy Birthday, Dear Daddy," and it was sung by the two little children of Zimbalist, aged 6 and 3 years.

Another surprise was the handsomely decorated birthday cake that centered the table.

Purser Charman, an ex-Oregon City man, told of the party in letters received here.

Zimbalist is on his way to Shanghai, China, to give two concerts, and then will go to Japan, where he will make a tour.

WARDEN TO QUIT TONIGHT

James Lewis to Take Charge of Oregon Penitentiary.

SALEM, Or., April 29.—(Special.)—Tomorrow night the management of the Oregon state penitentiary will pass into the hands of James Lewis, who recently was appointed warden to succeed L. F. Compton. Mr. Compton submitted his resignation to Governor Olcott a month ago and will leave next week for Seattle, where he will locate permanently.

Mr. Lewis, who has served as deputy warden of the prison for the past two years, will be succeeded by E. C. Hallie, principal keeper at the institution. Roy Kendall, until recently deputy sheriff of Multnomah county, will succeed Mr. Hallie.

In a statement given out here today Mr. Lewis said he would continue the policies adopted by Warden Compton, and that he does not contemplate making any changes in the personnel of officials and guards.

PEACE CONFERENCE AT DUBLIN SPLITS UP

No Agreement Is Reached After Three-Hour Session.

LIVOR STORES ARE RAIDED

Bonded Supplies Are Seized by Irregular Republican Troops.

BELFAST, April 29.—(By the Associated Press.)—Irregular republican troops today seized the bonded stores in Kilkenny and removed the whole stock of whisky to the Kilkenny jail. Free state officers went to the jail and issued an ultimatum to the commanders that unless the property was returned by 5 o'clock this afternoon, free state troops would move to the prison and take it by force.

All the bonded stores in Cork, Limerick, Galway and other southern and western centers also have been seized by irregulars with the apparent intention of depriving the Irish provisional government of revenues.

Insurgent troops in Cork as a consequence to the shooting of eight leading residents yesterday and the wounding of others. All male residents who exited left today on trains for Cork, all of which were crowded. Many refugees took the Rosslare route to England. Distressing scenes were witnessed at the railroad station when the refugees bid farewell to their wives and families.

Many stray shots were heard at Bandon where disquieting rumors were circulated.

Insurgent troops have seized the custom-house at Galway and the bonded warehouses belonging to John Milton of the same place, says the Irish Times today.

Commandant Fleming has taken charge of the books of the Wexford custom-house and announced he will take vigorous action to uphold the republic in the areas under his control, in the event of a satisfactory agreement not being reached.
