QUICKER HANDLING OF
YAKIMA CROP IN VIEW.

O. W. R. & N. Company Makes
Mapping From Fruit District
to Main Line.
PENDLETON, Or., June 10.—(Special)—Survey is being made by engineers of the O. W. R. & N. company through Umatilla county to determine the best route from the Yakima valley to the main line of the company, according to J. P. O'Brien, general manager. The work has been going on for the last two months and the present line of survey is to leave the main line about 18 miles east of Pendleton and to cross through Umatilla county near Athena, breaking into the state of Washington near Pasco.

TOURIST HOTEL IN SIGHT

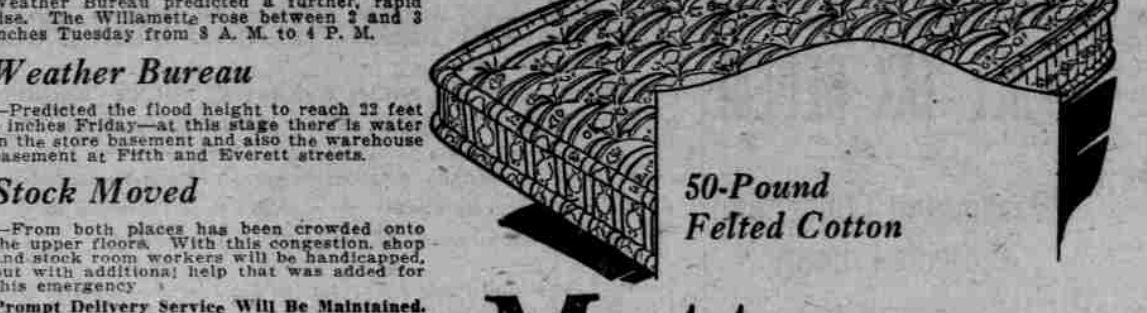
