### EFFORT MADE TO KEEP SECRETARY OF STATE FROM PLACING BILL ON NOVEMBER BALLOT.

### SALEM, OR., AUG. 5.—(Special.)

G. G. Greene of Oregon City, author of the so-called salmon fishing and fish propagation amendment, is being spirited with other persons, obtained fraudulently more than 5300 signatures to the petition necessary to place the issue on the ballot at the November election, according to a suit filed in the Marion county circuit court here today.

The suit was instituted by the state fish commission, under the title of state of Oregon ex rel. John H. Carson, district attorney, and seeks to prevent the secretary of state from placing the amendment on the ballot.

A copy of the complaint was served on the secretary of state tonight. Besides charging general fraud in obtaining signatures to the petition, the complaint alleges that many of the signers were aliens, that others did not live at the address given, that some were non-residents of the state and county, and that in a number of instances minors were allowed to qualify as voters.

The charge also was made in the complaint that a large number of the signatures were attested by notaries public who had knowledge at the time that many of them were obtained by fraud.

Another allegation in the complaint was that Mr. Greene, after circulating the petitions, offered to sell the fraudulent information for the consideration of \$15,000.

### LICENSE ORDINANCE UP

#### COUNCIL CONSIDERS CHANGE IN PROVISIONS.

#### Classifications of Hawkers and Peddlers to Be Made More Distinct by New Law.

A new ordinance under which license provisions of the city are to be changed and brought up to date is now in the hands of the council for its consideration and adoption.

While it makes no radical changes in license fees, it elaborates in detail the various classes of peddlers and hawkers and defines the limits of their activities.

A peddler is held to be "any person who, for himself or as agent of another, goes from place to place or from house to house within the city of Portland carrying for sale and offering or exposing for sale

any goods, wares or merchandises or produce of any article or thing for which a price is asked." The definition of a hawker uses the same language except that his selling activities are conducted "in or on the streets," or he may expose his commodity for sale "from a doorway, recess, alleyway, yard, lot or other place facing on a street, whether making outcry or not."

Persons peddling products of the land or fresh fish from a vehicle need pay only \$30 a year. Peddlers of cloth, fur, jewelry, silverware or plate wares will face a license of \$50, payable quarterly.

Persons who peddle at retail on foot need not pay a license, but they must pay a fee of but \$7.50, payable semi-annually. Those peddling any other unclassified articles on foot are required to pay \$5 a week for a license.

# MINING RESUMPTION APPEARS IN SIGHT

## Agreement is Forecast at Cleveland Conference.

### OPERATORS SOUNDED OUT

#### Owners Intimate Willingness to Meet Miners at Least at Halfway Post.

(Copyright, 1922, by The Oregonian.) WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 5.—

Partial relief for coal consumers appears to be in sight. Bituminous coal mining probably will be resumed within ten days in sections of the central competitive field—western Pennsylvania, Ohio, Indiana and Illinois—as the outcome of the conference staged for next Monday at Cleveland between officials of the United Mine workers of America and some big operators of the four states named.

Operators whose annual production totals somewhere between \$5,000,000 and \$9,000,000 some will be present at the Cleveland meeting. They will come chiefly from western Ohio, some northwest Virginia operators also will be there as well as some from Indiana and Illinois.

Whether any operators from western Pennsylvania will attend remains to be seen. The overshadowing factor in the industry, the Pittsburgh Coal Producers' association, will not leave its western Pennsylvania headquarters to negotiate.

Indications point strongly to the probability that President Lewis of the Mine workers, and the negotiating operators will agree within three or four days on a form of contract and that mining will be resumed shortly thereafter. A such plan to adopt the proposed wage scale. Should the full attendance of operators reach an understanding with Lewis, coal mining in the central competitive field would be resumed at the rate of not less than 1,000,000 tons a week.

That tonnage, together with an improved output from the non-union fields which now is on the increase, would bring the production of bituminous coal up to the point where it would approach industrial requirements.

Operators are Sounded. The Cleveland meeting will be attended only by operators who have intimated their willingness to meet the miners at least half way. The operators who will be there have all been sounded out by labor leaders during the three weeks that have elapsed since the president's programme was rejected. It is reliably reported here that most of these operators are not unwilling to accept the wage scale which expired last March on the basis of their contract with the miners and that there will be no strike if the wage scale is adopted.

Consumption of the Cleveland meeting is the coal strike agreement will go far toward bringing about a gradual resumption of bituminous coal mining throughout the United States, in the opinion of officials here. All the other union coal districts in the United States, except the anthracite field, wait upon the signing of a contract in the central competitive field. The union fields, outside of the four states named, are characterized by the outlying districts and it has been the custom for them to base their wage scale upon the contract signed between the miners and operators in the central competitive field.

Such a contract, if it should be signed at Cleveland, and even though only a small proportion of the central competitive field operators sign it, the miners could regard as a binding agreement for that field and thereafter open negotiations with operators in the outlying districts.

If Lewis succeeds in making a contract at Cleveland he will succeed also in creating a division in the operators' ranks which may result in considerable confusion for a time in the industry. Heretofore, the operators in the competitive field have acted as a unit. When their forces divide a new state of affairs will be brought about, the result of which cannot be foreseen.

Resumption of coal mining at the rate of 1,000,000 tons weekly in Ohio, Indiana, Illinois and western Pennsylvania, with the prospect of further resumption in the outlying districts, will accomplish much in relieving business generally from the check which is at present plainly manifest because of the coal shortage. The last week has witnessed a still further curtailment.
