France's Position on Debts
Declared Not Violent.

GREAT BRITAIN RAPPEL

Nation Declared to Have Forgotten
Last Reconstruction Bill
of French Republic.

PARIS, Aug. 5.—Next week's London conference will be one of the most important in the recent history of Europe. Complete settlement of the problems seems impossible, but a temporary partial adjustment of the most pressing matters is hoped for.

Premier Poincaré will meet with Lloyd George, Foreign Minister, and the other members of the cabinet. The French position is not to be discussed. The debate will be limited to general questions, and for a moratorium until 1934, the private claims which Germany has declined to meet and the problem of the inter-allied debts upon which the recent Balfour note was based.

Note Intended for America.

One need only contemplate these problems to realize how unlikely it is that the four ministers can reach a comprehensive solution of them in a few hours. London dispatches insist the Balfour note was entirely for America's information. It was intended to make America understand that at least a partial cancellation of the debts owed to it is imperative. The predominant opinion here is that the United States never will consent to this manner of raising the question. Most Frenchmen believe that the best way to settle Washington's interest is for the European governments to show some attitude among themselves for first settling the reparations debts.

Moreover, there is considerable surprise because Balfour spoke only of expenditures for the conduct of the war, forgetting that certain nations which served as battlefields have heavy charges of another kind. England, not in that category, easily can ignore these reconstruction expenses, but it seems strange to include the United States, whose means were exhausted by the war, and forget France's ruined territories sacrificed for the same cause.

Germany Voluntary Bankrupt.

Thus we always come back to the truth which England, alas, too often forgets, that no final solution of the debts is possible until Germany is compelled to put herself in a position to pay. Balfour, indeed, acknowledges in one phrase Germany is the international debtor, but neither Balfour nor Lloyd George are to do anything to arrange for the payment of this debt, which lies at the base of it all.

England says to the United States: "You'd do better not to claim what I owe," and to the European nations, "Pay what you owe because the United States hasn't repaid payments," while to Germany she simply says, "We'll give you another moratorium."

Germany has gone into voluntary bankruptcy. Nobody today denies this. She claims insolvency as a state because her budgetary and monetary policies have reduced the mark to worthlessness. She also refuses to pay private creditors, although the credits owed abroad by Germany total fifteen billion marks. Thus everybody in Germany, the government as well as the private individual, work to the same deception and Britain during the last two and one-half years has not taken any interest in this situation. She insists on her debtors' payments but disregards Germany's debts.

France's Position Defended.

France during 20 months has been neither exacting nor violent but has waited patiently for a fixed policy which has not been arrived at. Meanwhile, despite the fact that Germany destroyed a quarter of her productive capital, she has dug into her pocket for ninety billion francs to repair Germany's damages to her. If Balfour will not consider this no amount of notes can bring about that financial accord which the world sorely needs for its economic rebirth.

These are some of the reasons why I do not hope for much from the London conference, but if events should prove me wrong I'll be much happier than if they prove me right.

VERMONT LINEUP FORMS

STATE PRIMARY OCCURS
SEPTEMBER 12.

Only One Man to Date in Race
for Republican Nomination
for U. S. Senatorship.

MONTPELIER, Vt., Aug. 5.—(By the Associated Press.)—To succeed United States Senator Page of Vermont, who will retire at the close of his present term, only one man has announced himself for the republican nomination for the state primary September 12, Frank E. Greene, representative from the 1st district since 1916. On the democratic primary ticket which has been filed the name of Dr. W. B. Mayo of Northfield is listed for the senatorial nomination.

Martin S. Vilas, a lawyer of Burlington, is an avowed candidate for the republican nomination for congress in the 1st district in place of Mr. Greene. In the 2d district, opposition to the renomination of Porter H. Dale, representative, has been announced. The Democrats have ticketed James E. Kennedy of Burlington for 1st district nominee and John J. Wilson of Bethel for the 2d district.

For the governorship nomination, State Senator Proctor of Proctor and Abram Poole of Cornwall are expected to have an interesting contest on the republican side. Mr. Poole is a farmer, who represents Orange interest especially. Mr. Proctor is connected with the Vermont Marble company, founded by his father, the late United States senator. If he is nominated, he is elected he will be the third member of the family to occupy the gubernatorial chair. Redfield Proctor Jr. held the office from 1870 to 1880.

and his elder son, Fletcher D. Proctor, was elected in 1904 and served two years. Platforms of the two candidates differ but little. They are agreed that a programme of general economy is necessary, and favor a paring of appropriations for certain state institutions. The democratic nominee will be J. Holmes Jackson, mayor of Burlington.

For lieutenant-governor, Franklin S. Billings of Woodstock, speaker of the house, is opposed for the republican nomination, and the same is true of Harry A. Black and Benjamin Gates for renomination as secretary of state and state auditor, respectively. Attorney-General Archibald is expected to receive the nomination for a third term.

Two women have been announced as candidates for republican nomination for the lower branch of the legislature—Mrs. R. C. Ransom of Castleton and Miss Etta Beard of Orange.

BIG WAR GRAFT CHARGED

HARDING'S MOVE TO PROSECUTE
COMMENDED.

Senator Poindexter in Address at
Raymond Cites Dangers of
High Taxation.

RAYMOND, Wash., Aug. 5.—(Special.)—Senator Mike Poindexter addressed the largest audience last night at the Tokay theater that has ever assembled in this city to listen to a political address. He was introduced to the audience by E. E. Case, a prominent shingle manufacturer of this city.

Among the questions discussed were transportation, excessive taxation and its dangers, the excess profits tax, the Newberry case and gross extravagance and graft in the expenditure of war funds. He compared the means of transportation in the early days of the republic with those of the present, and called attention to the fact that under the present system all business prosperity is dependent upon the operation of the railroads and that interference with their operation would paralyze business and produce suffering and starvation. He announced his opposition to government ownership, having this principally upon the additional burden of taxation.

He said he always had been a friend of labor and that any of the lost demands of labor would always receive his earnest support and that he voted for the eight-hour day, the exclusion of orientals, and against child labor in mills and factories, and many other measures beneficial to labor.

Senator Poindexter said there had been gross extravagance and graft in the expenditure of billions of dollars of war funds and commended the administration for its movement toward the investigation and prosecution of these guilty.
