A petition too large to be carried was presented by a number of women to President Harding recently. The petition asked the release of all so-called political prisoners.

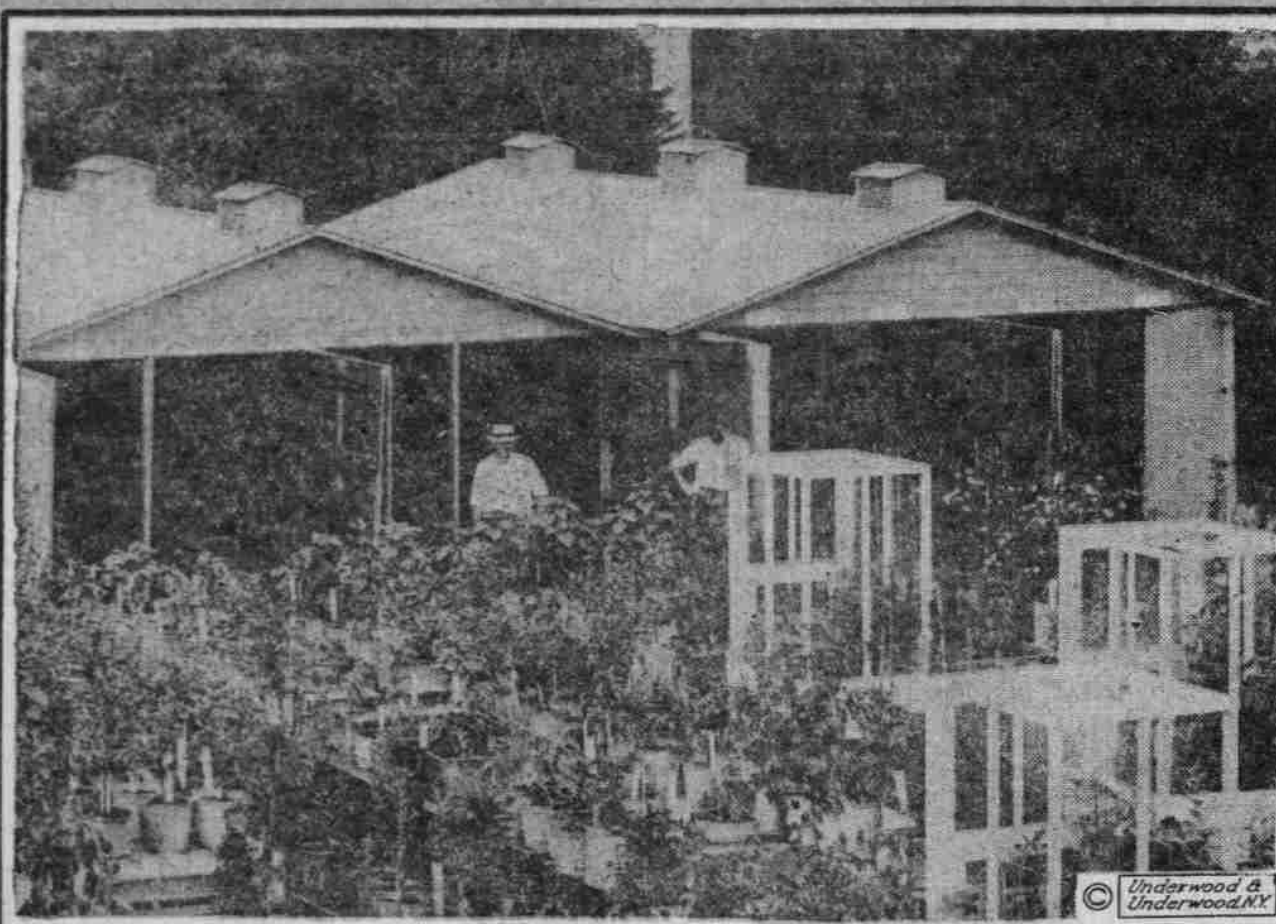
