The crop is not up to estimates made before harvest and is the most ineven crop that has been grown here since wheat was first seeded in the Klickitat vailey, about 40 years ago. Some growers report unusually heavy yields, while in many fields, whose 30 and 40 bushels to the acre was expected before the grain was cut, the yield has been from 15 to 20 bushels, and once wheat on lighter soil has run as low as three and four sucks to the acre.
