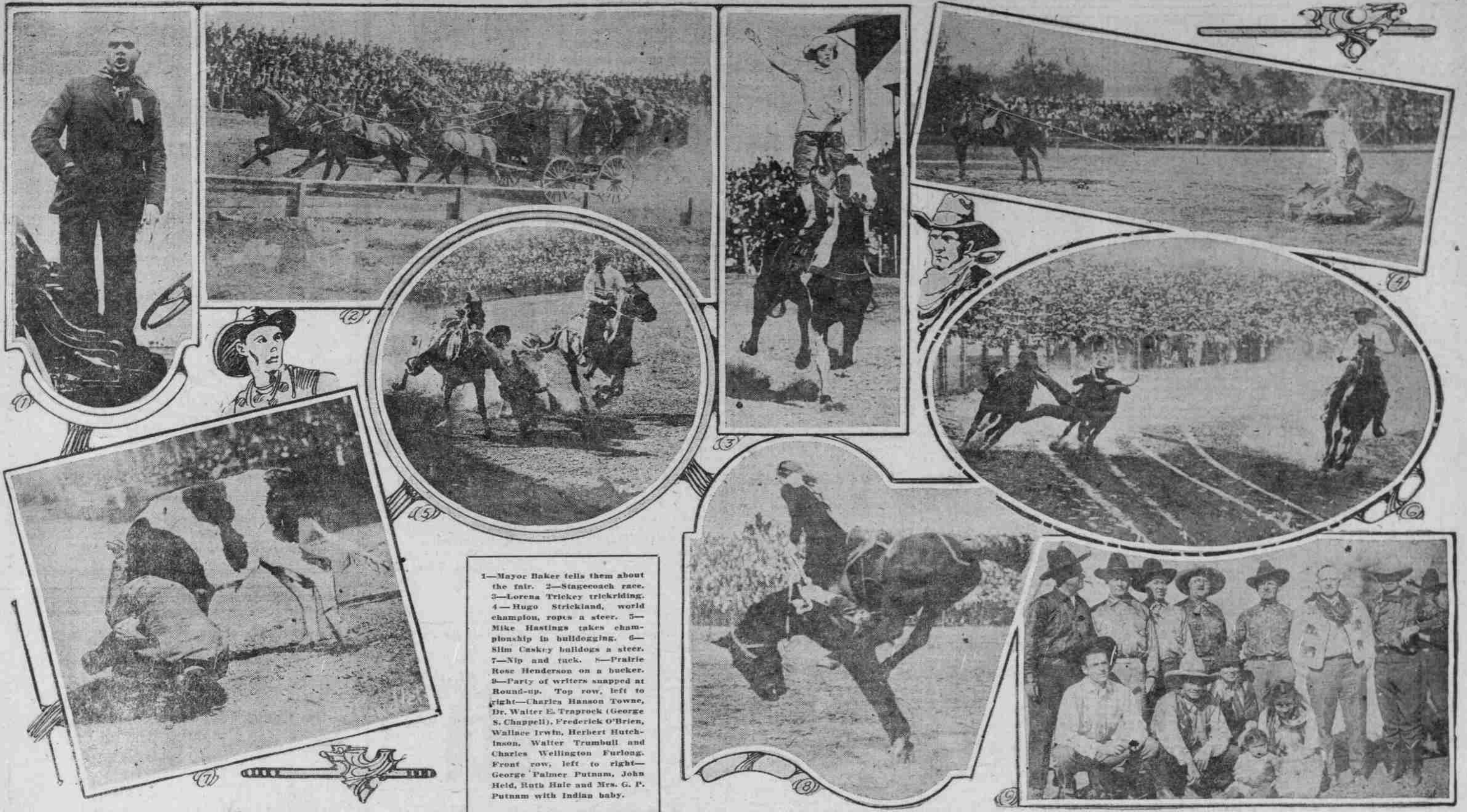


# ROUND-UP PROVES GREATEST WILD WEST SHOW OF HISTORY
