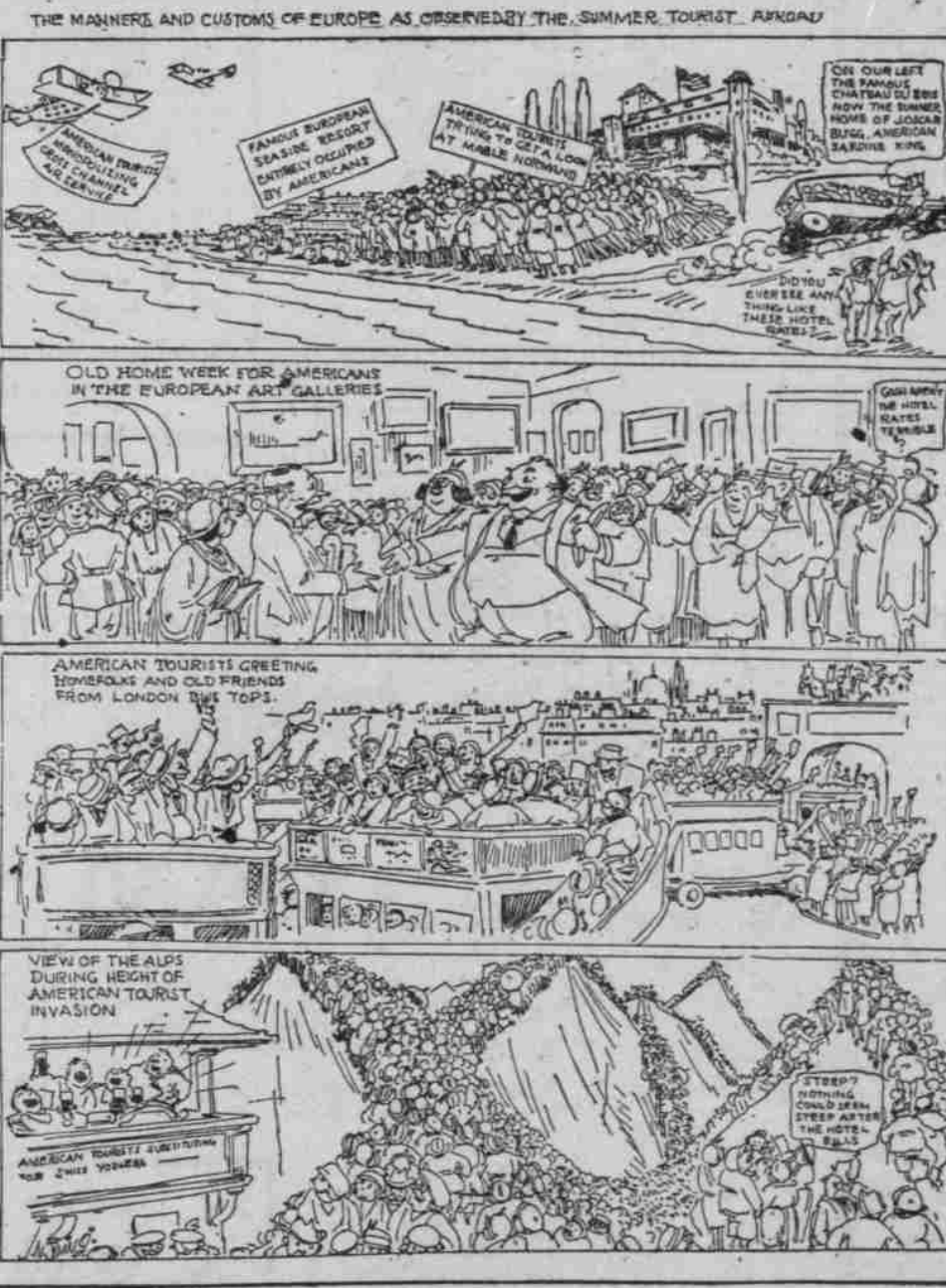
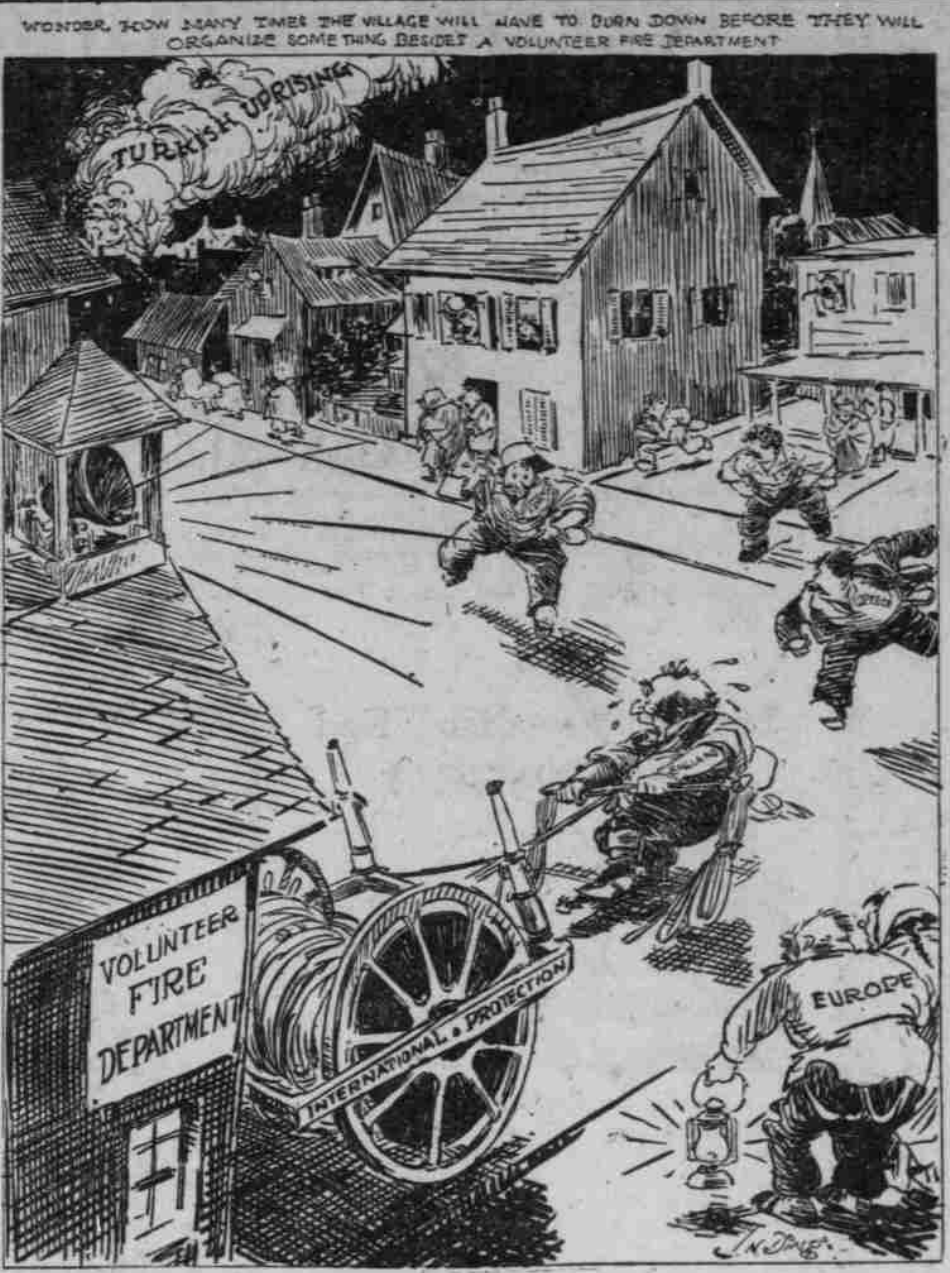

**Kansas City Man Talks at Nazarene Church.**

**Dr. J. B. Chapman Scheduled to Preach Tonight.**

**REV. J. B. CHAPMAN, D. D.**, of Kansas City, Mo., said to be one of the ablest pulpiter in the Nazarene denomination, will preach at the First church, corner of Twelfth and Main streets, tonight. Dr. Chapman has been prominent in the educational affairs of his church and recently has become chief editor of its general official organ. Rev. J. T. Little, a former pastor of First church, also will participate in the service. The music for the occasion will be furnished by the Nampa college quartet, composed of students of the Eastern Nazarene college, Nampa, Idaho.

This will be Dr. Chapman's first trip to the Pacific northwest. The service is for the general public. The pastor, Rev. D. Rand Pierce, will speak at 11 A. M.

Services of the Lincoln Methodist church, corner of East Fifty-second and Lincoln streets, will be held today as follows: 9:45 A. M.
