

DE VALERA AFRAID REVOLT WON'T DO

Republicans Would Be Ousted, Thinks Leader.

RIVAL BODY IS OPPOSED

Military Strength to Enforce Will Declared Lacking—Rejection is Forecast.

DUBLIN, Oct. 14.—If the republicans gained ascendancy and overthrew the provisional government they would themselves be ousted by the people at the next election.

This is the opinion of Eamon de Valera, very definitely expressed in correspondence which fell into the hands of the army, now being published as a white book.

Mr. de Valera's writings admit that he or other politicians have no influence over armed republicans, and he confesses the hopelessness of their cause.

He would resign if he thought the act would not prejudice the cause. Mr. de Valera wrote to Liam Lynch it was his desire to meet the executive of the republican forces and the answer, under the date of August 30, stated there was no intention of calling a meeting for some time, but "I will be only too pleased to receive your views any time on the general situation."

Resignation Threat Made. "This will not do," Mr. de Valera commented on the invitation of Mr. Murphy, former member of the Dail Eilreann.

ALBAJULIA, Roumania, Oct. 14.—At 8 o'clock Sunday morning King Ferdinand and Queen Marie in court costume will step off their sleeping car at this ancient Transylvanian town, 120 miles from Bucharest, to be crowned formally as rulers of Greater Roumania.

After old King Carol died at the end of 1914 Italy prevented the coronation of Ferdinand, who is the eldest of this branch of the Hohenzollern family, and Marie, granddaughter of Queen Victoria and the handsomest queen in Europe today.
