PORTLAND—Colonel Bush, Dear Sir: I have heard that Andy Gump is a joke, but the common sense of the people is absolutely unanimous in his support.

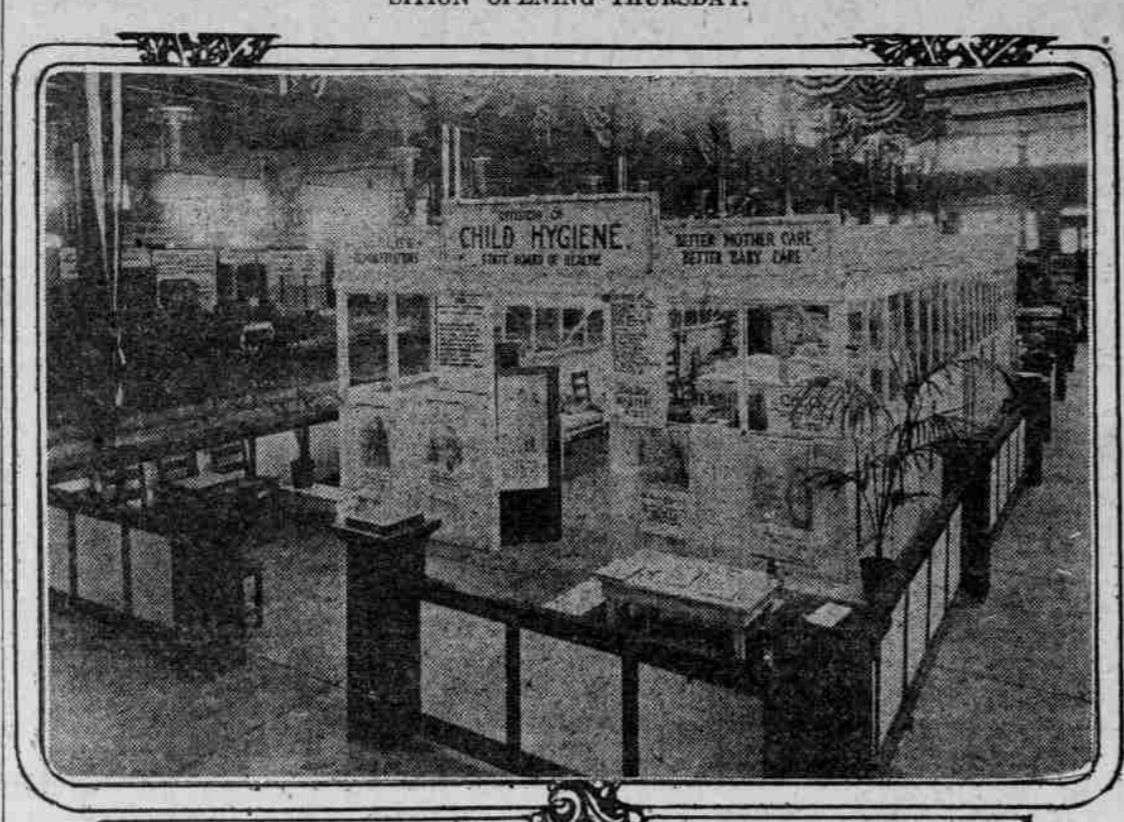
SKAMOKAWA, Wash.—To Colonel Bush: We've a candidate, we're proud to relate. We'll about his name and the slogan.

Everything is in readiness for the opening of the Oregon health exposition next Thursday, a show that members of the committee say will be bigger and cover a wider scope of hygienic subjects than any ever held on the Pacific coast.

In addition to the various organizations, more than 50 commercial firms will have exhibits at the show, all dealing with health and sanitation subjects.

Exposition Is Educator. "The exposition will provide an education for all who attend," said Dr. George Parrish, city health officer, who is vice-chairman of the exposition committee.
