FLOOD CONTROL IS URGED

PUYALLUP RIVER SITUATION SUBJECT OF HEARING.

Engineer Officer Takes Evidence to Guide Action of Congress Regarding Improvement.

TACOMA, Wash., Nov. 25.—(Special.)—The damages which have occurred on the Tacoma tide flats from recent floods do not constitute all the reason for control of the Puyallup river in its lowest reaches, but there is present danger that a devastating flood such as he believes has occurred several times during the last century may come and wipe out all the great property and industry on the tidelands, said Glenn L. Parker, in charge of the Tacoma office of the geological survey, in speaking at the hearing held at the chamber of commerce by Colonel Edward H. Schulz.

The hearing was for the purpose of collecting material to guide Colonel Schulz in making his report to congress upon the probable cost of control and the extent to which the federal government should assist the community in the work.

POWER DAM PROTESTED

PERMIT TO TACOMA OPPOSED BY FISHERIES BOARD.

Renewed Attempt to Block Lake Cushman Project Complicates Matters Despite Decision.

TACOMA, Wash., Nov. 25.—(Special.)—The state fisheries board is protesting the granting of a permit to the city of Tacoma to build a dam on the north fork of the Skokomish river and divert 1000 second feet of water therefrom for the generation of power. It was stated today by Commissioner Davidson of the municipal light department. The board has written to Marvin Chase, supervisor of hydraulics, who granted the city the permits recently after the state supreme court had upheld the city's right to condemn state fisheries lands, requesting that the permits immediately be revoked.

COMEDIAN TO AID CHEST

Ed Andrews, With Opera Company, to Entertain Crowd.

Ed Andrews, comedian, will lend his support tomorrow noon to the cause of the Portland Community Chest. Mr. Andrews will arrive in Portland today with the American Light Opera company, which opens a season of comic and light opera at the public auditorium this afternoon.

RUST MENACE IS SEEN

Oregon Declared in Danger of Invasion by Timber Diseases.

OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, Corvallis, Nov. 25.—(Special.)—Oregon is still entirely free from the white pine blister rust, but is in serious danger of invasion so long as the scourge is ravishing the British Columbia forests and breaking out in many Washington areas, reports H. P. Bars, plant pathologist of the state experiment station and director of control work in Oregon. The state and federal authorities are fighting to prevent spread of the rust into the Oregon pine belt. "Rigid observance of the quarantine laws by the citizens of Oregon and full co-operation in discovering and reporting the first appearance of the rust, will go far toward saving Oregon's great lumber industry based on its white pine forests," says Professor Bars.

MR. DILL GIVES SHOCK

SENATOR-ELECT IS AGAINST HEARST'S PET MEASURES.

Successor to Poindexter Opposes Sales Tax and Ship Subsidy and Always Has Been.

CITY UTILITY PROSPERS

Tacoma Light and Power Bureau Nets \$677,532.19 for Year.

TACOMA, Wash., Nov. 25.—(Special.)—The Tacoma municipal light and power department passed the \$1,000,000 mark in gross business for 1922 during October, the monthly report of the department sent to the city council showed today. Net income for the year stood at \$677,532.19. October operating receipts were \$118,093.21 and operating expenses \$13,873.33. The net income for the month, after addition of miscellaneous receipts and deductions of taxes and depreciation, was \$1,972.23. The ten months of 1922 produced operating income of \$1,029,142.78. The operating expense of the period was \$349,318.21.

ONE-DAY VACATION GIVEN

Mount Angel Students to Get Holiday Thursday.

MOUNT ANGEL COLLEGE, St. Benedict, Or., Nov. 25.—(Special.)—With the approach of the Thanksgiving vacation the question arises again as to whether a holiday will be allowed on the Friday following Thursday, November 30. Last year the faculty adopted a resolution to the effect that students would be given two holidays, but in the resolution was contained a provision that the Friday vacation would be withdrawn if the prevalent cutting of classes before and after vacation continued. This was averted last year when an appeal was made to the students to attend all classes and not miss to take convenient outgoing trains. The college calendar provides for Thanksgiving day only, and the faculty has consented to have only one day this year.
