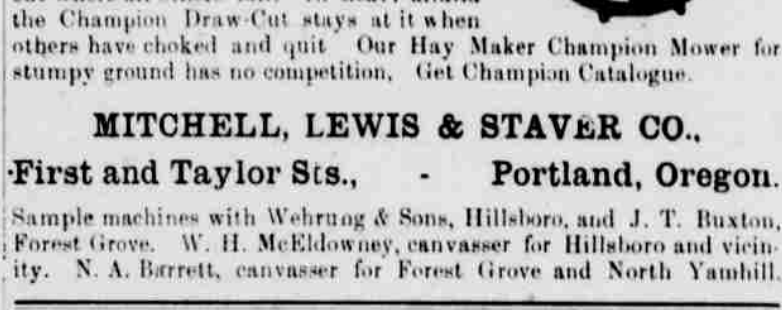
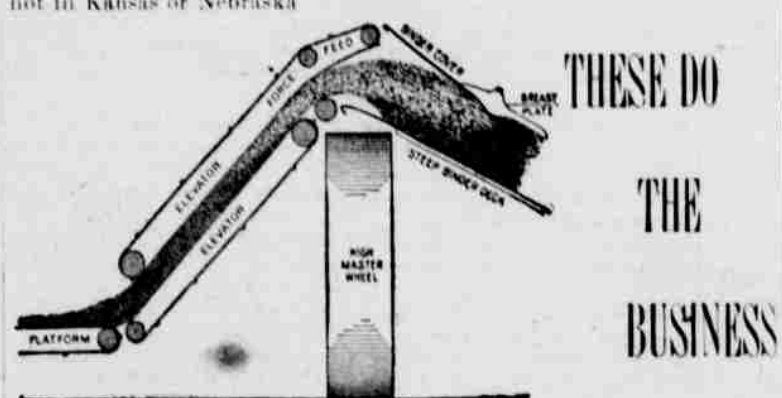


Table with multiple columns showing names of candidates and their respective vote counts for the Official Vote of Washington County, June Election, 1900.
