THE CHILD IS BORN.

The legislature has passed the Lewis & Clark Fair bill, and it is now law that the state shall assist the undertaking in the sum of \$500,000. As a matter of fact, there is much opposition to the measure among the farmers, and even those favoring it would not have felt disappointment had the bill failed. The Argus is of the opinion, however, that the proposed Fair will well repay this county for its share of taxation. This proposed Fair is of entirely different nature than those which have prevailed in the East. The proposition is an open invitation to eastern capital; to the eastern artisan; and to the eastern farmer who wants certainty in crop and a climate semi-tropical. All other fairs have been for historic celebration, chiefly. This is a celebration of an epoch in our National history that gave us our mines; gave us our vast cattle ranges; our wonderful forests, and a country whose soil rivals the Nile. Oregon will not only celebrate history, but the celebration is bound to do more than mere honor. To the shores of the Northwest will come thousands who will return with glowing reports of our resources and climate; realities and possibilities. Washington county—there is no use denying it—will benefit more from the fair than any other county in proportion, in the state. Considering population, wealth and taxation, it is bound to fare better than even Multnomah. The fair is bound to build closer communication; a better and bigger market. It will build for our children and our children's children. It will cost us something, but we should not attend church unless we make a noise in the contribution box.

It was completely established Sunday that the city of Hillsboro badly needs a large hall, one capable of seating two to five thousand people. Any building we have will hardly care for over 500 people, with many of them standing. The space between the Grange store and the Odd Fellows' hall would be an ideal place for a hall with galleries, and a structure could be put up that would accommodate a large audience. Are there not those here who can see their way clear to build such a public meeting place?

NOT THE RIGHT MEN

The trusts will never be suppressed by the men who express such admiration and tender consideration for them. In Senator Hoar's speech the following passage occurs:

"I confess I like to see Pierpont Morgan buying up great lines of ocean steamships. I like to hear of foreign potentates and principalities and powers bowing down when he visits the continent of Europe. We need great strength. We need great individual power if we are to rival foreign nations in the great matters which they also control by individual power. We must, if we can, look out in protecting ourselves, not to destroy them, nor to cramp them. We can give them a law which will not impair their strength and not check their natural and rightful growth, and that, I hope, is all we mean to do."

Men who talk that way are not the sort that will wage a successful warfare against those who have organized to loot the people.—Neh-Independent.

AVERY J PORTER.

Avery J. Porter, whose death occurred Friday in Portland, was born near this place July 24, 1863, and with the exception of two years spent at Fresno, Cal., had been a continuous resident of Washington county.
